A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING PHARMACISTS' ABILITY TO PROVIDE HIV INFECTION**

102 PREVENTION MEDICATIONS TO PATIENTS, AND, IN CONNECTION

103 THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. With regard to coverage under a health benefit plan for HIV infection prevention medications, the bill:

> Prevents a health insurance carrier from requiring a covered person to undergo step therapy or to receive prior authorization before receiving HIV infection prevention

drugs;

- ! Requires carriers to cover HIV infection prevention drugs prescribed or dispensed by a pharmacist and to provide an adequate consultative fee to those pharmacists; and
- ! Allows a pharmacist to prescribe and dispense HIV infection prevention drugs if the pharmacist fulfills specific requirements.
- 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
- 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 10-16-102, add
- 3 (27.5), (38.5), (50.5), and (50.7) as follows:
- 4 **10-16-102. Definitions.** As used in this article 16, unless the 5 context otherwise requires:
- 6 (27.5) "FDA" MEANS THE FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION IN
 7 THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, OR
 8 ANY SUCCESSOR ENTITY.
- 9 (38.5) "HIV INFECTION PREVENTION DRUG" MEANS PREEXPOSURE
 10 PROPHYLAXIS, POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS, OR OTHER DRUGS APPROVED
 11 BY THE FDA FOR THE PREVENTION OF HIV INFECTION.
- (50.5) "POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS" MEANS A DRUG OR DRUG
 COMBINATION THAT MEETS THE SAME CLINICAL ELIGIBILITY
 RECOMMENDATIONS PROVIDED IN CDC GUIDELINES, AS DEFINED IN
 SECTION 12-280-125.7.
- 16 (50.7) "PREEXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS" MEANS A DRUG OR DRUG
 17 COMBINATION THAT MEETS THE SAME CLINICAL ELIGIBILITY
 18 RECOMMENDATIONS PROVIDED IN CDC GUIDELINES, AS DEFINED IN
 19 SECTION 12-280-125.7.
- 20 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 10-16-104, add
 21 (18)(e) as follows:
- 22 10-16-104. Mandatory coverage provisions definitions -

rules. (18) Preventive health care services. (e) (I) ALL INDIVIDUAL
 AND GROUP HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS MUST PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR HIV
 INFECTION PREVENTION DRUGS THAT ARE PRESCRIBED AND DISPENSED
 PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-280-125.7.

5 (II) THE CARRIER SHALL PROVIDE A PHARMACIST WHO PRESCRIBES 6 AND DISPENSES HIV INFECTION PREVENTION DRUGS PURSUANT TO 7 SECTION 12-280-125.7 AN ADEQUATE CONSULTATIVE FEE, OR, IF MEDICAL 8 BILLING IS NOT AVAILABLE, AN ENHANCED DISPENSING FEE, THAT IS 9 EQUIVALENT OR THAT IS PROVIDED TO A PHYSICIAN OR ADVANCED 10 PRACTICE NURSE.

(III) THIS SUBSECTION (18)(e) DOES NOT APPLY TO AN INTEGRATED
HEALTH CARE DELIVERY SYSTEM THAT DISPENSES A MAJORITY OF
PRESCRIPTION DRUGS THROUGH INTEGRATED PHARMACIES.

SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 10-16-152 as
follows:

16 10-16-152. HIV prevention medication - limitations on
17 carriers - step therapy - prior authorization. A CARRIER SHALL NOT
18 REQUIRE A COVERED PERSON TO UNDERGO STEP THERAPY OR TO RECEIVE
19 PRIOR AUTHORIZATION BEFORE A PHARMACIST MAY, PURSUANT TO
20 SECTION 12-280-125.7, PRESCRIBE AND DISPENSE AN HIV INFECTION
21 PREVENTION DRUG.

SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-280-103, amend
(39)(c)(II)(C) and (39)(d); and add (39)(e) as follows:

12-280-103. Definitions - rules. As used in this article 280, unless
the context otherwise requires or the term is otherwise defined in another
part of this article 280:

27 (39) "Practice of pharmacy" means:

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1 (c) The provision of a therapeutic interchange selection or a 2 therapeutically equivalent selection to a patient if, during the patient's stay 3 at a nursing care facility or a long-term acute care hospital licensed under 4 part 1 of article 3 of title 25, the selection has been approved for the 5 patient:

(II) By one of the following health care providers:

7 (C) An advanced practice nurse prescriber licensed as a 8 professional nurse under section 12-255-110, registered as an advanced 9 practice nurse under section 12-255-111, and authorized to prescribe 10 controlled substances or prescription drugs pursuant to section 11 12-255-112, if the advanced practice nurse prescriber has developed an 12 articulated plan to maintain ongoing collaboration with physicians and 13 other health care professionals; and

(d) The dispensing of chronic maintenance drugs pursuant to
section 12-280-125.5 and board rules adopted in accordance with that
section; AND

(e) THE PRESCRIBING AND DISPENSING OF POST-EXPOSURE
PROPHYLAXIS, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 12-280-125.7 (1)(d), FOR
NONOCCUPATIONAL EXPOSURE TO HIV INFECTION AND PREEXPOSURE
PROPHYLAXIS, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 12-280-125.7 (1)(e), AND THE
ORDERING OF LAB TESTS IN CONJUNCTION WITH PRESCRIBING OR
DISPENSING THE DRUGS.

23 SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 12-280-125.7 as
24 follows:

25 12-280-125.7. Pharmacists' authority to prescribe and
26 dispense HIV infection prevention drugs - definitions - rules. (1) As
27 USED IN THIS SECTION:

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(a) "CDC" MEANS THE FEDERAL CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL
 AND PREVENTION IN THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND
 HUMAN SERVICES, OR ANY SUCCESSOR ENTITY.

4 (b) "CDC GUIDELINES" MEANS THE CDC GUIDELINES FOR
5 PREEXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS FOR THE PREVENTION OF HIV INFECTION AND
6 THE "UPDATED GUIDELINES FOR ANTIRETROVIRAL POST-EXPOSURE
7 PROPHYLAXIS AFTER SEXUAL, INJECTION DRUG USE, OR OTHER
8 NONOCCUPATIONAL EXPOSURE TO HIV", AND ANY ANALOGOUS
9 SUBSEQUENT GUIDELINES PUBLISHED BY THE CDC.

10 (c) "HIV INFECTION PREVENTION DRUG" MEANS PREEXPOSURE
11 PROPHYLAXIS, POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS, OR OTHER DRUGS APPROVED
12 BY THE FDA FOR THE PREVENTION OF HIV INFECTION.

(d) "POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS" MEANS A DRUG OR DRUG
14 COMBINATION THAT MEETS THE SAME CLINICAL ELIGIBILITY
15 RECOMMENDATIONS PROVIDED IN CDC GUIDELINES.

16 (e) "PREEXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS" MEANS A DRUG OR DRUG
17 COMBINATION THAT MEETS THE SAME CLINICAL ELIGIBILITY
18 RECOMMENDATIONS PROVIDED IN CDC GUIDELINES.

19 (2) A PHARMACIST MAY PRESCRIBE AND DISPENSE HIV INFECTION
 20 PREVENTION DRUGS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION.

21 (3) BEFORE PRESCRIBING OR DISPENSING HIV INFECTION

22 PREVENTION DRUGS TO A PATIENT, A PHARMACIST MUST:

23 (a) HOLD A CURRENT LICENSE TO PRACTICE IN COLORADO;

24 (b) BE ENGAGED IN THE PRACTICE OF PHARMACY;

25 (c) HAVE EARNED A DOCTORATE OF PHARMACY DEGREE OR
 26 COMPLETED AT LEAST FIVE YEARS OF EXPERIENCE AS A LICENSED

27 PHARMACIST;

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(d) CARRY ADEQUATE PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE AS
 DETERMINED BY THE BOARD; AND

3 (e) COMPLETE A TRAINING PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE
4 ACCREDITATION COUNCIL FOR PHARMACY EDUCATION, OR ITS SUCCESSOR
5 ENTITY, PURSUANT TO THE PROTOCOL DEVELOPED BY THE BOARD.

6 (4) THE BOARD SHALL PROMULGATE RULES NECESSARY TO
7 IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION, INCLUDING RULES THAT ESTABLISH PROTOCOLS
8 FOR PRESCRIBING AND DISPENSING PREEXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS AND
9 POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS.

SECTION 6. Appropriation. For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, \$13,347 is appropriated to the department of regulatory agencies for use by the division of insurance. This appropriation is from the division of insurance cash fund created in section 10-1-103 (3), C.R.S., and is based on an assumption that the division will require an additional 0.2 FTE. To implement this act, the division may use this appropriation for personal services.

SECTION 7. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
