Bill Summary

The bill authorizes a board of county commissioners to require the registration of businesses in the unincorporated portions of the county.

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 30-15-401, add (1)(t)
3 as follows:

30-15-401. General regulations - definitions. (1) In addition to
those powers granted by sections 30-11-101 and 30-11-107 and by parts
1, 2, and 3 of this article 15, the board of county commissioners may
adopt ordinances for control or licensing of those matters of purely local
concern that are described in the following enumerated powers:

9 (t) TO REQUIRE REGISTRATION OF BUSINESSES IN THE 10 UNINCORPORATED PORTIONS OF THE COUNTY; EXCEPT THAT SUCH POWER 11 DOES NOT INCLUDE THE POWER TO <u>LICENSE, COLLECT A FEE, OR COLLECT</u> 12 <u>FINES</u> FOR SUCH REGISTRATIONS. <u>THE COUNTY SHALL ONLY PUBLISH</u> 13 <u>REGISTRATION INFORMATION IN A MANNER SUCH THAT THE BUSINESS TYPE</u> 14 <u>IS AGGREGATED AND DOES NOT ALLOW FOR SEGREGATION OF INDIVIDUALS</u> 15 OR BUSINESS WHO SUPPLIED THE INFORMATION.

16 SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 17 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 18 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 19 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 20 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 21 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 22 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 23 November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 24 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
