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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101      **CONCERNING THE PROTECTION OF CRITICAL SERVICES THROUGH THE**  
102                    **CREATION OF SUSTAINABLE MEDICAID TRANSPORTATION**  
103                    **SAFETY REQUIREMENTS.**

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**Bill Summary**

Current law requires the public utilities commission (commission) to oversee the safety and oversight of medicaid nonmedical and nonemergency medical transportation services (transportation services). The bill eliminates the commission's responsibility to oversee the safety and oversight of the transportation services.

1 MEDICAID RECIPIENTS PURSUANT TO ARTICLES 4 TO 6 OF THIS TITLE 25.5.

2 THE RULES AND PROCESSES MUST:

3 (a) ENSURE THE SAFETY OF PASSENGERS;

4 (b) PROTECT PASSENGER ACCESS TO TRANSPORTATION SERVICES;

5 AND

6 (c) ESTABLISH DRIVER AND VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS THAT  
7 MINIMIZE FINANCIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE BURDENS FOR PROVIDERS,  
8 DIRECT SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS AS DEFINED IN SECTION 25.5-6-406,  
9 LONG-TERM CARE DIRECT CARE WORKERS, CONTRACTORS, AND OTHER  
10 EMPLOYEES PROVIDING TRANSPORTATION SERVICES.

11 (2) TO THE EXTENT POSSIBLE, THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL USE  
12 EXISTING OVERSIGHT PROCEDURES TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE  
13 REQUIREMENTS AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION.

14 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-10.1-105, **amend**  
15 (1) introductory portion, (1)(j), and (1)(k); and **add** (1)(l) as follows:

16 **40-10.1-105. Transportation not subject to regulation.** (1) The  
17 following types of transportation are not subject to regulation under this  
18 ~~article~~ ARTICLE 10.1:

19 (j) Transportation performed by the federal government, a state,  
20 or any agency or political subdivision of either, whether through an  
21 intergovernmental agreement, contractual arrangement, or otherwise; ~~and~~

22 (k) Transportation of repossessed property by a secured creditor  
23 or assignee, or by a reposessor on behalf of a secured creditor or  
24 assignee, when repossessing pursuant to section 4-9-629; ~~C.R.S.~~ AND

25 (l) TRANSPORTATION BY MOTOR VEHICLES USED FOR NONMEDICAL  
26 TRANSPORTATION AND NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION  
27 PROVIDED THROUGH MEDICAID PURSUANT TO SECTION 25.5-1-802.

1           **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-10.1-110, **amend**  
2 (1)(a) as follows:

3           **40-10.1-110. Criminal history record check - rules.** (1) (a) An  
4 individual who wishes to drive: A taxicab for a motor carrier that is the  
5 holder of a certificate to provide taxicab service issued under part 2 of  
6 this article 10.1; a motor vehicle for a motor carrier that is the holder of  
7 a permit to operate as a charter bus, children's activity bus, luxury  
8 limousine, ~~medicaid client transport~~, or off-road scenic charter under part  
9 3 of this article 10.1; or a motor vehicle for a motor carrier that is the  
10 holder of a permit to operate as a large-market taxicab service under part  
11 7 of this article 10.1 must have the individual's fingerprints taken by a  
12 local law enforcement agency or any third party approved by the  
13 Colorado bureau of investigation for the purpose of obtaining a  
14 fingerprint-based criminal history record check.

15           **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-10.1-301, **repeal**  
16 (9), (10), and (11) as follows:

17           **40-10.1-301. Definitions.** As used in this part 3, unless the  
18 context otherwise requires:

19           (9) ~~"Medicaid client transport" means a motor vehicle that~~  
20 ~~transports passengers who are recipients of medicaid pursuant to articles~~  
21 ~~4 to 6 of title 25.5, C.R.S., and are being transported under a medicaid~~  
22 ~~nonemergent medical transportation contract or a medicaid nonmedical~~  
23 ~~transportation contract.~~

24           (10) ~~"Medicaid nonemergent medical transportation contract"~~  
25 ~~means a contract or provider agreement with the department of health~~  
26 ~~care policy and financing or its approved agent for the purpose of~~  
27 ~~providing nonemergent medical transportation to approved recipients of~~

1     ~~medicaid.~~

2             ~~(11) "Medicaid nonmedical transportation contract" means a~~  
3 ~~contract or provider agreement with the department of health care policy~~  
4 ~~and financing or its approved agent for the purpose of providing~~  
5 ~~nonmedical transportation to approved recipients of medicaid.~~

6             **SECTION 5.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-10.1-302, **amend**  
7 **(1)(a); and repeal (2)(b)** as follows:

8             **40-10.1-302. Permit requirements.** (1) (a) A person shall not  
9 operate or offer to operate a charter bus, children's activity bus, fire crew  
10 transport, luxury limousine, ~~medicaid client transport~~, or off-road scenic  
11 charter in intrastate commerce without first having obtained a permit  
12 therefor from the commission in accordance with this part 3.

13             ~~(2) (b) (I) In addition to the requirements of paragraph (a) of this~~  
14 ~~subsection (2), a person applying for a medicaid client transport permit~~  
15 ~~shall provide the commission proof of a medicaid client transport~~  
16 ~~agreement with the department of health care policy and financing or its~~  
17 ~~approved agent in such form and with such information as the~~  
18 ~~commission may require.~~

19             ~~(II) The department of health care policy and financing may~~  
20 ~~transfer medicaid money to the commission to assist the commission in~~  
21 ~~its regulation of medicaid transport under this article. Any money that the~~  
22 ~~commission receives from the department of health care policy and~~  
23 ~~financing is continuously appropriated to the commission.~~

24             **SECTION 6. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
25 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
26 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
