A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE RECOGNITION OF VETERANS IN RELATION TO

102 CERTAIN PARKS WITHIN THE STATE CAPITOL COMPLEX.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill authorizes the installation of a sculpture within the state capitol grounds to memorialize Major General Maurice Rose and changes the name of the parks where the sculpture will stand to "Colorado veterans' park".

Shading denotes HOUSE amendment. Double underlining denotes SENATE amendment. Capital letters or bold & italic numbers indicate new material to be added to existing statute. Dashes through the words indicate deletions from existing statute.

3 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-80-1401, amend
4 (4) and (5); and add (6) as follows:

5 24-80-1401. Colorado veterans' monument preservation trust 6 fund - preservation trust committee - park name change. (4) The 7 preservation trust committee shall have discretion in determining the 8 amount of funds to allocate from the trust fund to meet the purposes of 9 this part 14; except that only the interest derived from the principal in the 10 trust fund may be expended by the preservation trust committee. All gifts, 11 grants, and donations received by the department of personnel pursuant 12 to subsection (5) of this section shall be credited to the trust fund and 13 retained as principal in the trust fund. All interest earned on the 14 investment of moneys MONEY in the fund shall be continuously 15 appropriated to the department of personnel for allocation to the 16 preservation trust committee. The preservation trust committee shall 17 determine annually how much of the interest generated from the principal 18 in the trust fund will be spent and shall determine and approve what types 19 of maintenance and repair work will be performed for the purposes of 20 maintaining, enhancing, and repairing the Colorado veterans' monument 21 and any fallen heroes memorials in Lincoln COLORADO VETERANS' park 22 in Denver, Colorado, and for maintaining Lincoln COLORADO VETERANS' 23 park. The principal of the trust fund and any unappropriated interest 24 earned on the principal of the trust fund at the close of any fiscal year 25 shall remain in the trust fund and shall not be transferred to or revert to 26 the general fund.

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(5) The department of personnel is authorized to receive gifts,

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1 grants, and donations from private or public sources for the trust fund. 2 Such gifts, grants, and donations, together with any other moneys MONEY 3 appropriated or transferred by the general assembly, shall be transmitted 4 to the state treasurer who shall credit the same to the trust fund. Moneys 5 MONEY in the trust fund shall be used for maintaining and enhancing the 6 Colorado veterans' monument and **Lincoln** COLORADO VETERANS' park, 7 but shall not be used to supplant existing appropriations for maintenance 8 of the monument or **Lincoln** COLORADO VETERANS' park. For purposes of 9 section 20 of article X of the state constitution, any donations received for 10 the trust fund shall not be included in state fiscal year spending.

(6) ON AND AFTER MAY 31, 2021, THE PARKS PREVIOUSLY KNOWN
AS "LINCOLN PARK" AND "LIBERTY PARK", BOUNDED BY LINCOLN ON THE
EAST, BROADWAY ON THE WEST, FOURTEENTH AVENUE ON THE SOUTH,
AND COLFAX AVENUE ON THE NORTH, SHALL BE COLLECTIVELY KNOWN AS
"COLORADO VETERANS' PARK".

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
