This bill exempts public or assisted housing benefits from the requirement that a recipient be verified as lawfully present in the United States. Starting in FY 2021-22, the bill will decrease state workload on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: This fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

Currently, both federal and state law require that individuals verify lawful presence to receive certain government benefits. This bill removes the requirement to verify lawful presence for public or assisted housing benefits.

State Expenditures

The Division of Housing in the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) administers state-funded programs that are only available to households where every member is lawfully present. These include housing vouchers, down payment assistance grants or loans, single family owner-occupied housing rehabilitation loans, and affordable housing units. This bill increases the number of individuals who may participate in these programs, increasing demand on annual appropriations. The bill minimally reduces workload for the department to process applicants.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect April 15, 2021.
