Sunset bill. SB 21-144 continues the Homeland Security and All-Hazards Senior Advisory Committee in the Department of Public Safety, which is scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2021. State fiscal impacts under the bill include only the continuation of the program's current expenditures, which are minimal. The program is continued indefinitely.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

The Homeland Security and All-Hazards Senior Advisory Committee is scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2021. This bill continues the committee indefinitely.

Background

The advisory committee was established in 2012 to provide guidance to various state entities involved in public safety, make recommendations regarding homeland security grants, and facilitate intergovernmental and private sector cooperation. It is housed in the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management within the Department of Public Safety. It consists of one main 21-member committee, made up of state officials and their public- and private-sector appointees, and several subcommittees. Committee members serve on a voluntary basis and receive no compensation, but may be compensated for travel or other expenses incurred while performing their duties.

Continuing Program Impacts

The Department of Public Safety's expenditures on committee travel and meeting facilitation are minimal. If this bill is enacted, current expenditures will continue for the program starting in FY 2021-22. If the bill is not enacted, the program will end on September 1, 2021, and state expenditures will decrease beginning that same year.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
