## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE OFFICES OF

102 THE GOVERNOR, LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, AND STATE PLANNING

103 AND BUDGETING.

#### **Bill Summary**

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- Governor Lieutenant Governor State Planning and Budgeting, Office of Information Technology, Colorado Benefits Management System, Colorado
  Benefits Management System -- Of this appropriation, \$5,000,000 remains available until the close of the 2022-23 fiscal year.
- 12 Governor Lieutenant Governor State Planning and Budgeting, Office of Information Technology, Colorado Benefits Management System, Colorado Benefits Management System -- Of this appropriation, \$136,240 reappropriated funds remain available for expenditure until the close of the 2022-23 state fiscal year. It is the General Assembly's intent that this appropriation be used to implement S.B. 19-235.

SECTION 2. Appropriation to the office of the governor for
 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020. In Session Laws of Colorado
 2021, amend section 15 (1) and (2) of chapter 371, (HB 21-1289), as
 follows:

5 Section 15. Appropriations. (1) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, 6 \$35,000,000 is appropriated to the office of the governor for use by the 7 office of information technology for use by the Colorado broadband 8 office. This appropriation is from the digital inclusion grant program fund 9 created in section 24-37.5-904 (2), C.R.S., and of money the state 10 received from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund. The 11 Colorado broadband office may use this appropriation to implement the 12 digital inclusion grant program created in section 24-37.5-904 (1)(a), 13 C.R.S. Any money appropriated in this subsection (1) not expended prior 14 to July 1, 2021 JULY 1, 2022, is further appropriated to the office of the 15 governor for use by the office of information technology for the  $\frac{2021-22}{2021-22}$ 16 2022-23 state fiscal year for the same purpose.

17 (2) For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, \$35,000,000 is appropriated 18 to the office of the governor for use by the office of information 19 technology for the broadband deployment board. This appropriation is 20 from the broadband stimulus account in the broadband administrative 21 fund created in section 24-37.5-119 (4), C.R.S., and of money the state 22 received from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund. The 23 broadband deployment board may use this appropriation to implement the 24 broadband stimulus grant program created in section 24-37.5-119 (9.5), 25 C.R.S. Any money appropriated in this subsection (2) not expended prior 26 to July 1, 2021 JULY 1, 2022, is further appropriated to the office of the 27 governor for use by the office of information technology for the  $\frac{2021-22}{2021-22}$

- 2 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
