A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CRITERIA RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF 102 TELEPHARMACY OUTLETS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Currently, a "telepharmacy outlet" must be located more than 20 miles from the nearest prescription drug outlet or other telepharmacy outlet. The bill removes this geographic restriction on the operation of telepharmacy outlets.

The bill authorizes the state board of pharmacy (board) to adopt limited rules concerning telepharmacy outlets.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-280-103, amend
3	(50)(a)(II), (50)(a)(III), and (50)(a)(IV); repeal (50)(b); and add (50)(c)
4	as follows:
5	12-280-103. Definitions - rules. As used in this article 280, unless
6	the context otherwise requires or the term is otherwise defined in another
7	part of this article 280:
8	(50)(a) "Telepharmacy outlet" means a remote pharmacy site that:
9	(II) At the time of registration, is located more than twenty miles
10	<u>from the nearest prescription drug outlet and from any other telepharmacy</u>
11	outlet registered under this article 280 IN AN AREA OF NEED;
12	(III) Is connected via computer link, video link, and audio link, or
13	via other functionally equivalent telecommunication equipment, with a
14	central pharmacy LOCATED IN THIS STATE that is registered under this
15	article 280; and
16	(IV) Has a pharmacy technician on site who, under the remote
17	supervision of a licensed pharmacist located at the central pharmacy IN
18	THIS STATE, performs the tasks described in subsection (38.5)(a) of this
19	section.
20	(b) The board may adopt rules as necessary to specify additional
21	criteria for a telepharmacy outlet that the board deems necessary.
22	(c) As used in subsection (50)(a)(II) of this section, "area of
23	NEED" MEANS:
24	(I) Any health facility licensed or certified by the
25	DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT PURSUANT TO
26	<u>SECTION 25-1.5-103 (1); OR</u>

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1	(II) ANY AREA WHERE A DEMONSTRATION OF NEED IS APPROVED
2	BY THE BOARD.
3	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-280-107, add (3)
4	as follows:
5	12-280-107. Rules. (3) The board $\underline{\text{SHALL}}$ adopt rules as
6	NECESSARY TO SPECIFY ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR A TELEPHARMACY
7	OUTLET. THE BOARD'S RULES ARE LIMITED TO RULES CONCERNING THE
8	FOLLOWING:
9	(a) APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS;
10	(b) STRUCTURAL AND EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS;
11	(c) STAFFING AND TRAINING REQUIREMENTS;
12	(d) CONSULTANT PHARMACIST VISITATION REQUIREMENTS;
13	(e) INVENTORY RECORD-KEEPING AND STORAGE REQUIREMENTS;
14	(f) Establishing policies and procedures relating to
15	TELEPHARMACY OPERATIONS; <u>AND</u>
16	(g) The number of telepharmacy outlets that may be
17	OPERATED BY A CENTRAL <u>PHARMACY.</u>

19	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
20	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
21	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
22	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
23	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
24	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
25	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
26	November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
2.7	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
