Bill Summary

SENATE Amended 2nd Reading April 22, 2022 The bill creates the economic mobility program within the department of public health and environment and creates the economic mobility program fund, requiring a \$4 million transfer to the fund from the economic recovery and relief cash fund.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 23-1-139 as
3	<u>follows:</u>
4	23-1-139. Department directive - contract for use of online
5	platform for public benefits. The department shall contract for
6	AND FACILITATE THE USE OF AN ONLINE PLATFORM BY ANY INSTITUTION
7	OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN COLORADO, WHETHER PUBLIC OR PRIVATE, IN
8	ORDER TO ASSIST STUDENTS IN ACCESSING PUBLIC BENEFITS. INDIVIDUAL
9	INSTITUTIONS THAT USE THE ONLINE PLATFORM THAT THE DEPARTMENT
10	CONTRACTS FOR ARE REQUIRED TO CONTRIBUTE FINANCIALLY FOR USE OF
11	THE PLATFORM.
12	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add part 14 to article
13	20.5 of title 25 as follows:
14	PART 14
15	ECONOMIC MOBILITY PROGRAM
16	25-20.5-1401. Economic mobility program - creation - fund -
17	reporting - legislative declaration. (1) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
18	HEREBY FINDS AND DECLARES THAT:
19	(a) THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC HAS HAD DEVASTATING ECONOMIC
20	AND HEALTH CONSEQUENCES ACROSS THE STATE;
21	(b) The COVID-19 pandemic has specifically
22	DISPROPORTIONATELY IMPACTED FAMILIES AND INDIVIDUALS EARNING
23	LOW OR NO INCOME AND EXACERBATED PRE-EXISTING DISPARITIES;

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(c) ECONOMIC MOBILITY ACTIVITIES, SUCH AS TAX CREDITS AND
 OTHER INVESTMENTS IN FINANCIAL WELL-BEING, IMPROVE FAMILY
 RESILIENCY AND LONG-TERM HEALTH AND EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES FOR
 COLORADANS AND THEIR FAMILIES;

5 (d) TAX CREDITS FOR FAMILIES AND INDIVIDUALS EARNING LOW OR 6 NO INCOME ARE ASSOCIATED WITH FEWER ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EVENTS, 7 REDUCED INFANT MORTALITY, REDUCED CHILD MALTREATMENT, REDUCED 8 TRAUMA, AND BETTER CHILDHOOD NUTRITION. INCOME FROM TAX 9 CREDITS LEADS TO BENEFITS AT VIRTUALLY EVERY STAGE OF LIFE, AND 10 CHILDREN IN FAMILIES RECEIVING THE TAX CREDITS ARE HEALTHIER, DO 11 BETTER IN SCHOOL, ARE LIKELIER TO ATTEND COLLEGE, AND CAN BE 12 EXPECTED TO EARN MORE AS ADULTS.

(e) TAX CREDITS ALSO SUPPORT LOCAL ECONOMIES;

(f) PROGRAMS AND SERVICES TO INCREASE AWARENESS AND
UPTAKE OF ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS, SUCH AS TAX CREDITS AVAILABLE TO
LOW OR NO INCOME FAMILIES AND INDIVIDUALS, WILL RESPOND TO THE
COVID-19 PANDEMIC'S NEGATIVE IMPACT IN ALL COMMUNITIES; AND

18 (g) THE PROGRAM CREATED IN THIS SECTION AND SERVICES
19 DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION ARE IMPORTANT GOVERNMENT SERVICES.

20 (2) SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, THE DEPARTMENT
21 SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT THE ECONOMIC MOBILITY PROGRAM,
22 REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "PROGRAM", TO IMPROVE HEALTH
23 AND EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES ASSOCIATED WITH REDUCED POVERTY AND
24 IMPROVED ECONOMIC MOBILITY FOR COLORADANS.

(3) (a) THE ECONOMIC MOBILITY PROGRAM FUND, REFERRED TO IN
THIS SECTION AS THE "FUND", IS HEREBY CREATED IN THE STATE
TREASURY. THE FUND CONSISTS OF MONEY TRANSFERRED TO THE FUND

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PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3)(d) OF THIS SECTION, ALL PRIVATE AND
 PUBLIC MONEY RECEIVED THROUGH GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS THAT
 IS TRANSMITTED TO THE STATE TREASURER AND CREDITED TO THE FUND,
 AND ANY OTHER MONEY THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE
 OR TRANSFER TO THE FUND.

6 (b) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL CREDIT ALL INTEREST AND
7 INCOME DERIVED FROM THE DEPOSIT AND INVESTMENT OF MONEY IN THE
8 FUND TO THE FUND.

9 SUBJECT TO ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BY THE GENERAL (c) 10 ASSEMBLY, THE DEPARTMENT MAY EXPEND MONEY FROM THE FUND FOR 11 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM AND FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES: 12 (I) OUTREACH AND ENGAGEMENT OF AND BY PARTNERS WHO HAVE 13 DIRECT CONNECTIONS WITH FAMILIES AND LOW-WAGE INDIVIDUALS AND 14 WITH HISTORICALLY DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES TO PROMOTE 15 AWARENESS AND UPTAKE OF ECONOMIC SUPPORTS, INCLUDING TAX 16 CREDITS;

17 (II) FACILITATING COMMUNICATION, TRAINING, AND TECHNICAL
18 ASSISTANCE AMONG STATE AGENCY PARTNERS, PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCIES,
19 AND COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTING ECONOMIC
20 MOBILITY;

(III) GRANTS TO NONPROFITS, LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCIES,
AND OTHER COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS WHO ASSIST INDIVIDUALS
WITH ACCESSING ECONOMIC SUPPORTS, INCLUDING THOSE PROVIDING FREE
LOW-INCOME TAX FILING SERVICES THROUGH INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE
CERTIFIED VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE SITES;

26 (IV) GRANTS TO SUPPORT ENHANCED INFRASTRUCTURE TO
 27 IMPROVE ACCESS TO FREE TAX FILING ASSISTANCE AND OTHER ECONOMIC

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SUPPORTS THROUGH DEVELOPMENT OF ONLINE PLATFORMS THAT PROVIDE
 LINKAGES TO SERVICES;

3 (V) DEVELOPMENT AND DISSEMINATION OF COMMUNICATIONS
4 MATERIALS RELATED TO ECONOMIC MOBILITY PROVIDING INFORMATION
5 ON ELIGIBILITY AND DIRECTING COLORADANS TO RESOURCES TO BE ABLE
6 TO ACCESS ECONOMIC SUPPORTS, INCLUDING TAX CREDITS;

7 (VI) GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSES, AND DIRECT AND INDIRECT
8 PROGRAM COSTS; AND

9 (VII) EVALUATION OF EVIDENCED-BASED AND PROMISING
10 PRACTICES IN ECONOMIC MOBILITY STRATEGIES.

(d) ON JULY 1, 2022, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER
FOUR MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE ECONOMIC RECOVERY AND RELIEF
CASH FUND CREATED IN SECTION 24-75-228 (2)(a) TO THE FUND.

(4) THE DEPARTMENT AND ANY PERSON THAT RECEIVES MONEY
FROM THE DEPARTMENT SHALL COMPLY WITH THE COMPLIANCE,
REPORTING, RECORD-KEEPING, AND PROGRAM EVALUATION
REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED BY THE OFFICE OF STATE PLANNING AND
BUDGETING AND THE STATE CONTROLLER IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION
24-75-226 (5).

SECTION 3. Appropriation. (1) For the 2022-23 state fiscal
 year, \$1,799,570 is appropriated to the department of public health and
 environment for use by the prevention services division. This
 appropriation is from the economic mobility program cash fund created
 in section 25-20.5-1401 (3)(a), C.R.S. To implement this act, the division
 may use this appropriation as follows:
 (a) \$1,720,060 for maternal and child health, which amount is

2	(b) \$79,510 for administration, which amount is based on an
3	assumption that the division will require an additional 1.2 FTE.
4	(2) For the 2022-23 state fiscal year, \$171,000 is appropriated to
5	the department of higher education. This appropriation is from the general
6	fund. To implement this act, the department may use this appropriation
7	for an online program to assist students in accessing public benefits.
8	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
9	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
10	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
