Bill Topic: INCLUDE VENDOR NAME IN WEB-BASED INFORMATION SYSTEM

Summary of Fiscal Impact:

This bill requires the state and certain counties to include the vendor's legal name in any expenditure listed on the existing state online transparency system. It minimally increases state workload and may increase local expenditures, beginning in FY 2022-23.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill.

Summary of Legislation

This bill requires the state and certain counties to include a vendor's legal name in any expenditure listed on the existing state online transparency system managed by the Department of Personnel and Administration (DPA), except when it is determined that including the vendor's legal name would not best serve the public interest, or is prohibited by law.

State Expenditures

The DPA will have a minimal workload increase to include the additional information in the online transparency system. This work can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Local Government

Some counties may be exempt from current requirements if the county budget, revenue, and expenditure data are already posted on a county website. Counties that are not exempt may incur one-time costs to conform to the new requirements. In the future, non-compliance with the new transparency requirements could result in loss of grant funds if the Department of Local Affairs considers the transparency requirements in evaluating grant applications, as permitted in current law.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
