The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has proposed a supplemental budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the December 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The \$5,000,000 General Fund transfer to the Local Firefighter Safety and Disease Prevention Fund for FY 2021-22 included in this bill will reduce by \$5,000,000 the amount of General Fund reserve that is carried forward into

FY 2022-23. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2021-22 supplemental budget package the \$5,000,000 General Fund revenue decrease that would result from the passage of this bill.
