Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes a provision that appropriates a total of \$104,538 cash funds from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2022-23. The provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE.
