Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes a clause that appropriates \$5,000,000 cash funds from the Behavioral and Mental Health Cash Fund (which originated as federal funds from the American Rescue Plan Act) to the Department of Human Services for FY 2022-23. The provision also makes those funds available to the Department through December 30, 2024.
