Bill Summary

The bill establishes the veterans mental health services program (program) in the behavioral health administration to facilitate access to mental health services for veterans who have exhausted their annual number of sessions with a mental health-care provider covered by the veteran's federal veterans administration benefits. 2	NOT INCLUDE IN THE REPORT PERSONALLY IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION
3	THAT MAY BE USED, ALONE OR IN CONJUNCTION WITH ANY OTHER
4	INFORMATION, TO IDENTIFY A SPECIFIC INDIVIDUAL.
5	SECTION 2. Appropriation. For the 2023-24 state fiscal year,
6	\$642,645 is appropriated to the department of military and veterans
7	affairs for use by the division of veterans affairs. This appropriation is
8	from the general fund and is based on an assumption that the division will
9	require an additional 1.6 FTE. To implement this act, the division may
10	use this appropriation for the veterans mental health services program.
11	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
12	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
13	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
