## A BILL FOR AN ACT

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov</u>.)

Current law authorizes the inspection, testing, quarantine, condemnation, and destruction of livestock when there is an outbreak of an infectious or contagious disease. The bill:

• Removes the requirement that the inspection, testing, and quarantine of livestock occur pursuant to rules promulgated

by the commissioner of agriculture (commissioner);

- Moves the authority to condemn and destroy livestock from the state agricultural commission to the commissioner and only when the commissioner, state veterinarian, and governor agree that the condemnation and destruction is justified and necessary for the safety and protection of the livestock of the state; and
- Changes the appraisal process that is required before livestock may be condemned and destroyed.

The bill gives the commissioner the authority to investigate all buildings, yards, pens, pastures, and other areas in which any animals are kept, handled, or transported to ensure compliance with the "Livestock Health Act". The commissioner may:

- Administer oaths and take statements;
- Issue administrative subpoenas requiring the attendance of • witnesses and the production of all books, memoranda, papers, and other documents, articles, or instruments; and
- Compel the disclosure by witnesses of all facts known to them that are relevant to the matters under investigation.

Under current law, it is an unlawful act to alter or falsify a health certificate issued for the import of livestock into the state. The bill makes it an unlawful act to alter or falsify a health certificate issued for the export of livestock out of the state.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 35-50-107 as

3 follows:

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35-50-107. Disease detection and prevention. Whenever the 5 commissioner reasonably suspects that livestock are in or from an area of 6 concentration or point of distribution where there is a potential for the 7 spread of disease or that the livestock may have been exposed to or are 8 suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, the commissioner 9 may, as a sanitary measure, conduct surveillance or otherwise inspect the 10 suspected livestock. under such rules as the commissioner may adopt.

11 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-50-109, amend 12 (1), (2), and (5) as follows:

35-50-109. Inspection and testing. (1) Whenever it becomes
 known to the commissioner that an infectious or contagious disease exists
 among livestock of the state, the commissioner may inspect all livestock
 in the state. under such rules as the commissioner may adopt.

5 (2) Whenever it becomes known to the commissioner that an 6 infectious or contagious disease exists among livestock of the state, the 7 commissioner may compel the testing of all livestock in the state. <del>under</del> 8 <del>such rules as the commissioner may adopt.</del>

9 (5) Whenever any livestock are tested, the livestock shall be 10 individually identified, as specified by the commissioner. in such rules as 11 the commissioner may adopt. Official identification shall not be removed 12 from such livestock or altered in any fashion.

SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 35-50-109.5 as
follows:

15 35-50-109.5. Investigations - access - administrative subpoena.
(1) THE COMMISSIONER MAY INVESTIGATE AS NECESSARY TO ENSURE
17 COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ARTICLE 50.

(2) (a) AT ANY REASONABLE TIME DURING REGULAR BUSINESS
HOURS, UPON CONSENT OR UPON OBTAINING AN ADMINISTRATIVE SEARCH
WARRANT, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL HAVE ACCESS TO ALL BUILDINGS,
YARDS, PENS, PASTURES, AND OTHER AREAS IN WHICH ANY ANIMALS ARE
KEPT, HANDLED, OR TRANSPORTED FOR THE PURPOSE OF CARRYING OUT
THIS ARTICLE 50 OR ANY RULE PROMULGATED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE
50.

25 (b) (I) THE COMMISSIONER IS AUTHORIZED TO:

26 (A) ADMINISTER OATHS AND TAKE STATEMENTS;

27 (B) ISSUE ADMINISTRATIVE SUBPOENAS REQUIRING THE

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ATTENDANCE OF WITNESSES AND THE PRODUCTION OF ALL BOOKS,
 MEMORANDA, PAPERS, AND OTHER DOCUMENTS, ARTICLES, OR
 INSTRUMENTS; AND

4 (C) COMPEL THE DISCLOSURE BY WITNESSES OF ALL FACTS KNOWN 5 TO THEM THAT ARE RELEVANT TO THE MATTERS UNDER INVESTIGATION. 6 (II) UPON THE FAILURE OR REFUSAL OF ANY WITNESS TO OBEY ANY 7 SUBPOENA, THE COMMISSIONER MAY PETITION THE DISTRICT COURT TO 8 COMPEL, AND, UPON A PROPER SHOWING, THE COURT MAY ENTER AN 9 ORDER COMPELLING, THE WITNESS TO APPEAR AND TESTIFY OR TO 10 PRODUCE DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE. FAILURE TO OBEY SUCH AN ORDER OF 11 THE COURT IS PUNISHABLE AS A CONTEMPT OF COURT.

12 (3) COMPLAINTS OF RECORD MADE TO THE COMMISSIONER AND
13 THE RESULTS OF THE COMMISSIONER'S INVESTIGATIONS MAY, IN THE
14 DISCRETION OF THE COMMISSIONER, BE CLOSED TO PUBLIC INSPECTION
15 DURING THE INVESTIGATORY PERIOD, EXCEPT AS PROVIDED BY COURT
16 ORDER.

SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 35-50-110 as
follows:

19 **35-50-110. State livestock disease diagnostic laboratories.** The 20 rocky mountain regional animal health laboratory IN THE DEPARTMENT 21 and the Colorado state university veterinary diagnostic laboratories, 22 collectively known as the state livestock disease diagnostic laboratories, 23 shall function to provide disease testing to support the department's 24 livestock disease programs. The laboratories shall be scaled to provide 25 testing of such volume as to meet the potential disease control, protection, 26 and surveillance needs of the livestock industry of the state.

27 SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-50-111, amend

1 (3) as follows:

35-50-111. Quarantine. (3) Once testing has confirmed the
presence of an infectious or contagious disease, the commissioner may
quarantine any specific livestock, premises, county, district, or section of
the state for the purpose of preventing the spread of any infectious or
contagious disease within the state. under such rules as the commissioner
may adopt.

8 SECTION 6. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-50-113, amend
9 (1) and (2) as follows:

35-50-113. Condemnation of livestock. (1) (a) Whenever the
state veterinarian reports to the commission COMMISSIONER that there
exists an outbreak of contagious or infectious disease among livestock of
this state of such a character as to endanger and imperil the livestock of
the state, the commission, upon approval of COMMISSIONER, AFTER
CONSULTATION WITH the governor, may issue an order of condemnation
to condemn and destroy:

(I) Any livestock so infected or any livestock that has been
exposed to or is deemed by the commission COMMISSIONER capable of
communicating such THE contagious or infectious disease to other
livestock; and to condemn and destroy

(II) Any barns, sheds, corrals, pens, or other property that the
commission COMMISSIONER may determine is necessary to be destroyed
in order to prevent the spread of such THE contagion or infection. Such
(b) THE condemnation and destruction shall MAY take place only
when, in the opinion of the commission COMMISSIONER, THE STATE
VETERINARIAN, and the governor, an emergency exists and such THE
action is justified and necessary for the safety and protection of the

1 livestock of this state.

2 (2) Whenever the state agricultural commission COMMISSIONER 3 finds it necessary to condemn and destroy any animals or property within 4 this state because of any contagious or infectious disease, such THE 5 animals or property shall not be destroyed until after AN INDEPENDENT 6 APPRAISER APPOINTED BY THE COMMISSIONER MAKES a fair appraisal has 7 been made of the value of such THE animals or property by three 8 appraisers, one to be appointed by the state agricultural commission, one 9 by the owner of the property to be destroyed, and the third to be selected 10 by these two. Such appraisers THE APPRAISER shall make a report to the 11 commission COMMISSIONER under oath as to their THE appraisal, and the 12 commission COMMISSIONER shall forward such THE appraisal to the 13 governor with such THE recommendation as to the proportion of such 14 appraisement to THAT THE APPRAISAL be considered a just bill against the 15 state of Colorado. as the commission may think right.

SECTION 7. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-50-116, amend
(1) introductory portion and (1)(m) as follows:

18 35-50-116. Unlawful acts. (1) Unless otherwise authorized by
19 law, it is unlawful and a violation of this article ARTICLE 50 for any
20 person:

(m) To alter or falsify any health certificate issued pursuant to
 section 35-50-112 FOR THE IMPORT OR EXPORT OF ANIMALS INTO OR OUT
 OF THE STATE.

SECTION 8. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
