#### **Bill Summary**

Current law prohibits a licensed retail marijuana store from selling retail marijuana or retail marijuana products over the internet or through delivery. The bill repeals the prohibition.

Dashes through the words or numbers indicate deletions from existing law. 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 44-10-601, repeal
3 (7)(c) as follows:

4 44-10-601. Retail marijuana store license - rules - definitions.
5 (7) (c) A licensed retail marijuana store shall not sell retail marijuana or
6 retail marijuana products over the internet nor deliver retail marijuana or
7 retail marijuana products to a person not physically present in the retail
8 marijuana store's licensed premises.

9 SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 10 11 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 12 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 13 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 14 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 15 16 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 17 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
