# An Act

SENATE BILL 23-129

CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

**SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of public safety for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022.** In Session Laws of Colorado 2022, section 2 of chapter 507, (HB 22-1329), **amend** Part XVIII and the affected totals, as Part XVIII (1)(A) and the affected totals are amended by section 18 of chapter 170, (HB 22-1133), as follows:
