September 1, 2023. Pursuant to the recommendation in the department of regulatory agencies' sunset review and report, the bill continues the health equity commission indefinitely.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, **repeal**
3 **(14)(a)(I); and add (20)(a)(IV)** as follows:

5 **declaration - definition - repeal.** (14) (a) The following statutory
6 authorizations for the designated advisory committees are scheduled for
7 repeal on September 1, 2023:

14 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-2206, **repeal (5)**
15 **as follows:**

17 (5) This section is repealed, effective ~~September 1, 2023~~ **SEPTEMBER 1,**
18 **2029.** Prior to the repeal of this section, the commission is subject to
19 review as provided in section 2-3-1203 ~~C.R.S.~~

20 **SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
21 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
22 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
23 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
24 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this

1 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
2 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
3 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
4 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
