## 101 CONCERNING ADOPTING FEDERAL REGULATIONS TO THE "INDIAN

102 CHILD WELFARE ACT OF 1978" AS STATE LAW.

#### **Bill Summary**

The bill adopts federal regulations concerning the "Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978" as state law so that Colorado will continue to ensure that Indian children are protected in cases of guardianship and adoption.

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 19-1-126, amend (4)
3 as follows:

4 19-1-126. Compliance with the federal "Indian Child Welfare
5 Act of 1978". (4) If the court finds that the child is an Indian child, the
6 court shall ensure compliance with The requirements of the federal
7 "Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978", 25 U.S.C. sec. 1901 et seq., AND THE
8 RELATED REGULATIONS LOCATED AT 25 CFR 23, IN EFFECT AS OF
9 FEBRUARY 9, 2023, ARE INCORPORATED INTO AND ADOPTED AS STATE
10 LAW.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
