# A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF COMPENSATION TO PEOPLE WHO SUFFER DAMAGES BECAUSE OF GRAY WOLF DEPREDATION, AND, IN CONNECTIONS THEREWITH, REDUCING AN APPROPRIATION.

# **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <a href="http://leg.colorado.gov">http://leg.colorado.gov</a>.)

The bill creates the wolf depredation compensation fund (fund) to compensate landowners and agricultural producers for depredation of livestock and working animals by wolves. For the 2023-24 state fiscal year and each state fiscal year thereafter, the state treasurer is directed to transfer \$350,000 from the general fund to the fund. At the end of the

2023-24 and 2024-25 state fiscal years, any unencumbered balance in the fund that exceeds \$100,000 is transferred to the wildlife cash fund. At the end of subsequent state fiscal years, the amount transferred to the wildlife cash fund is any unencumbered balance in the fund that exceeds 120% of the amount spent from the fund in the previous state fiscal year.

Each year, the director of the division of parks and wildlife will issue a report and make a presentation at the appropriate "SMART Act" hearing.

The bill reduces by \$175,000 the fiscal year 2023-24 general fund appropriation to the department of natural resources for use by the division of parks and wildlife for the reintroduction and management of gray wolves.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 finds and declares that: 4 (a) In the 2020 general election, the citizens of Colorado passed 5 proposition 114, which is codified as section 33-2-105.8, Colorado 6 Revised Statutes, and mandates that the parks and wildlife commission 7 restore the gray wolf to the state; 8 (b) The text of proposition 114 includes the requirement that the 9 parks and wildlife commission pay "fair compensation to owners of 10 livestock for any losses of livestock caused by gray wolves..."; and 11 (c) It is in the best interest of livestock owners and the intention 12 of proposition 114's supporters to dedicate a source of funding that is available solely for wolf depredation compensation. 13 14 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 33-1-127 as 15 follows: 16 Wolf depredation compensation 33-1-127. fund -17 compensation for damages - definitions - rules - repeal. (1) AS USED 18 IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

9	DIRECT PHYSICAL TRAUMA RESULTING IN THE DEATH OF OR INJURY TO
10	LIVESTOCK OR TO A LIVESTOCK GUARD OR HERDING ANIMAL.
11	(2) (a) The wolf depredation compensation fund is created
12	IN THE STATE TREASURY. THE FUND CONSISTS OF MONEY TRANSFERRED TO
13	THE FUND IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (2)(b) OF THIS SECTION AND
14	ANY OTHER MONEY THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE OR
15	TRANSFER TO THE FUND.
16	(b) (I) FOR THE 2023-24 STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE STATE
17	TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND
18	DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE FUND. THIS SUBSECTION
19	(2)(b)(I) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024.
20	(II) FOR THE 2024-25 STATE FISCAL YEAR AND EACH STATE FISCAL
21	YEAR THEREAFTER, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL ANNUALLY TRANSFER
22	THREE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO
23	THE FUND.
24	(c) The state treasurer shall credit all interest and
25	INCOME DERIVED FROM THE DEPOSIT AND INVESTMENT OF MONEY IN THE
26	FUND TO THE FUND.
27	(3) (a) Money in the fund is continuously appropriated to

2	GUARD OR HERDING ANIMALS THAT SUFFER DAMAGES DUE TO WOLF
3	DEPREDATION.
4	(b) For <u>AN OWNER OF LIVESTOCK OR A LIVESTOCK GUARD OR</u>
5	HERDING ANIMAL TO BE COMPENSATED FROM THE FUND:
6	(I) ONE OR MORE GRAY WOLVES MUST HAVE KILLED OR INJURED
7	LIVESTOCK OR A <u>LIVESTOCK GUARD OR HERDING ANIMAL OWNED BY THE</u>
8	<u>CLAIMANT</u> , AS DETERMINED BY THE DIVISION; AND
9	(II) THE <u>CLAIMANT</u> MUST BE ELIGIBLE FOR COMPENSATION UNDER
10	THE GRAY WOLF RESTORATION AND MANAGEMENT PLAN, CREATED IN
11	ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 33-2-105.8, OR IN ANY RULES PROMULGATED
12	BY THE COMMISSION.
13	(c) THE COMMISSION MAY PROMULGATE RULES TO IMPLEMENT
14	AND ADMINISTER THIS SECTION. THE RULES MAY:
15	(I) INCLUDE ADDITIONAL CRITERIA NECESSARY TO RECEIVE
16	COMPENSATION FROM THE FUND; OR
17	(II) AUTHORIZE AND SET CRITERIA FOR COMPENSATION FROM THE
18	FUND FOR INDIRECT LIVESTOCK LOSS.
19	(4) AT THE END OF A STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE STATE TREASURER
20	SHALL TRANSFER FROM THE FUND TO THE WILDLIFE CASH FUND, CREATED
21	IN SECTION $33-1-112(1)$ , ANY UNEXPENDED AND UNENCUMBERED MONEY
22	REMAINING IN THE FUND THAT EXCEEDS:
23	(a) For state fiscal years 2023-24 and 2024-25, one hundred
24	THOUSAND DOLLARS; AND
25	(b) For state fiscal year 2025-26 and subsequent fiscal
26	YEARS, AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE AMOUNT OF MONEY EXPENDED FROM
27	THE FUND DURING THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING STATE FISCAL YEAR PLUS

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1	TWENTY PERCENT OF THIS AMOUNT.
2	(5) (a) On or before January 31, 2025, and on or before
3	JANUARY 31 OF EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE DIRECTOR SHALL SUBMIT A
4	WRITTEN REPORT TO THE APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES OF REFERENCE AS
5	DETERMINED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 2-7-203 (1). FOR THE
6	IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE REPORT MUST
7	INCLUDE:
8	(I) THE NUMBER OF LIVESTOCK AND <u>LIVESTOCK GUARD OR</u>
9	<u>HERDING</u> ANIMALS KILLED BY GRAY WOLVES;
10	(II) THE NUMBER OF CLAIMS MADE FOR COMPENSATION FROM THE
11	FUND;
12	(III) THE NUMBER OF COMPENSATION CLAIMS THAT WERE
13	APPROVED AND DENIED;
14	(IV) THE REASONS FOR THE DENIAL OF COMPENSATION CLAIMS;
15	(V) THE AMOUNT OF MONEY PAID FOR COMPENSATION FROM THE
16	FUND;
17	(VI) AN EXPLANATION OF THE NUMBER AND COST OF LOSSES DUE
18	TO WOLF DEPREDATION;
19	(VII) THE NUMBER OF RESIDENT GRAY WOLVES;
20	(VIII) THE NUMBER OF RESIDENT GRAY WOLF PACKS;
21	(IX) THE ACTIVITY OF THE GRAY WOLF PACKS, INCLUDING DATES,
22	DETERMINED FROM GRAY WOLVES BEING TRACKED; AND
23	(X) THE NUMBER OF GRAY WOLF BREEDING PAIRS AND THE
24	POPULATION CHANGES OF RESIDENT GRAY WOLVES.
25	(b) Notwithstanding section 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), the
26	REPORTING REQUIREMENT SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (5)(a) OF THIS
2.7	SECTION CONTINUES INDEFINITELY

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1	(c) The division shall not include, in the report made
2	UNDER SUBSECTION (5)(a) OF THIS SECTION, INFORMATION THAT THE
3	DIVISION MAY WITHHOLD UNDER SECTION 24-72-204 (2)(a)(X).
4	(6) (a) COMPENSATION PAID UNDER THIS SECTION IS
5	REIMBURSEMENT FOR DAMAGES AND NOT INCOME SUBJECT TO TAXATION.
6	(b) This section does not authorize the release of any
7	PRIVATE INFORMATION ABOUT A CLAIMANT OR A CLAIMANT'S
8	COMPENSATION.
9	SECTION 3. Appropriation - adjustments to 2023 long bill. To
10	implement this act, the general fund appropriation made in the annual
11	general appropriation act for the 2023-24 state fiscal year to the
12	department of natural resources for use by the division of parks and
13	wildlife for the implementation of Proposition 114 for the reintroduction
14	and management of gray wolves is decreased by \$175,000.
15	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
16	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
17	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
