### **Resolution Summary**

The concurrent resolution amends section 13 of article II of the Colorado constitution to permit any person lawfully permitted to possess

a handgun pursuant to federal and state law to carry a concealed handgun in any area of the state. The resolution permits the general assembly, by law, to prohibit concealed carry of handguns at the following places:

- Into a place where carrying firearms is prohibited by federal law;
- Onto the property of a public elementary, middle, junior high, or high school; or
- Into a public building at which security personnel and weapons screening devices are permanently in place at each entrance to the building, security personnel electronically screen each person who enters the building, and security personnel require each person who is carrying a weapon of any kind to leave the weapon in the possession of security personnel while the person is in the building.

**SECTION 1.** At the election held on November 5, 2024, the secretary of state shall submit to the registered electors of the state the ballot title set forth in section 2 for the following amendment to the state constitution:

In the constitution of the state of Colorado, **amend** section 13 of article II as follows:

**Section 13. Right to bear arms.** (1) The right of no person to keep and bear arms in defense of his THE PERSON'S home, person, and property, or in aid of the civil power when thereto legally summoned, shall be called in question. but nothing herein contained shall be construed to justify the practice of carrying concealed weapons.

(2) A PERSON WHO IS AT LEAST TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE AND IS PERMITTED TO POSSESS A HANDGUN PURSUANT TO FEDERAL AND STATE LAW HAS THE AUTHORITY TO CARRY A CONCEALED HANDGUN IN ANY

1	AREA OF THE STATE; EXCEPT THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY, BY LAW,
2	PROHIBIT THE CARRYING OF A CONCEALED HANDGUN AS FOLLOWS:
3	(a) Into a place where the carrying of firearms is
4	PROHIBITED BY FEDERAL LAW;
5	(b) Onto the real property, or into any improvements
6	ERECTED THEREON, OF A PUBLIC ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE, JUNIOR HIGH, OR
7	HIGH SCHOOL; OR
8	(c) INTO A PUBLIC BUILDING AT WHICH SECURITY PERSONNEL AND
9	WEAPONS SCREENING DEVICES ARE PERMANENTLY IN PLACE AT EACH
10	ENTRANCE TO THE BUILDING, SECURITY PERSONNEL ELECTRONICALLY
11	SCREEN EACH PERSON WHO ENTERS THE BUILDING, AND SECURITY
12	PERSONNEL REQUIRE EACH PERSON WHO IS CARRYING A WEAPON OF ANY
13	KIND TO LEAVE THE WEAPON IN POSSESSION OF SECURITY PERSONNEL
14	WHILE THE PERSON IS IN THE BUILDING.
15	SECTION 2. Each elector voting at the election may cast a vote
16	either "Yes/For" or "No/Against" on the following ballot title: "Shall
17	there be an amendment to the Colorado constitution concerning the right
18	to carry a concealed handgun in any area of Colorado except those areas
19	prohibited by state law?"
20	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Except as otherwise provided in section 1-40-123,
21	Colorado Revised Statutes, if at least fifty-five percent of the electors
22	voting on the ballot title vote "Yes/For", then the amendment will become
23	part of the state constitution.
