Summary of Legislation

Beginning January 1, 2024, the bill allows a former member of the General Assembly to obtain a name badge indicating that the individual is a former representative or senator. The Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House must develop a process to issue a name badge if requested. The former member must pay the cost of the name badge.

impacts identified in the final fiscal note do not take effect.

State Revenue and Expenditures

The current cost for a single name badge is about \$20. Former members must pay this cost for each name badge. It is assumed that this revenue will be passed through by the legislative department directly to the vendor and not be subject to TABOR. The Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House will jointly develop an application and payment procedure for former members to obtain the name badge directly from the chamber. This effort does not require any change in appropriations.
