Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$2,280,950 total funds, including \$1,213,950 General Fund and \$1,067,000 cash funds, to multiple departments for FY 2023-24, as shown in the following table.

L.014 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment **L.014** (attached) adds a requirement that the Department of Personnel conduct a restroom survey of state-owned buildings, to be delivered to the Capitol Development Committee by July 1, 2024, prior to any signage adjustments. Furthermore, the amendment clarifies that signage adjustments begin at the start of FY 2024-25. The amendment reduces the fiscal impact of the bill to \$450,000 General Fund to be appropriated to the Department of Personnel in FY 2023-24, of which \$50,000 is for a restroom survey of state-owned buildings. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree on the fiscal impact of this amendment. Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$450,000 General Fund to the Department of Personnel. The provision also makes \$400,000 of this appropriation, if unexpended at the end of FY 2023-24, available for expenditure for the same purpose through the end of FY 2025-26.

If L.014 is adopted, the Committee should adopt J.002 but <u>not</u> J.001.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2023-24 based on the March 2023 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes two set-asides for legislation outside of the package: (1) \$30.0 million General Fund for bills that create ongoing obligations; and (2) \$469.0 million for bills that create one-time obligations for FY 2023-24 (see table below).

The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the above placeholders (a total of \$74.9 million).

This bill creates a one-time obligation and requires a General Fund appropriation of \$1.2 million for FY 2023-24, reducing the \$469.0 million set aside by that amount. If **L.014** amd **J.002** are adopted, the bill would create a one-time obligation and require a General Fund appropriation of \$450,000 for FY 2023-24, reducing the \$469.0 million set aside by that amount.
