Summary of Legislation

The bill eliminates the requirement that an employer must contribute to the Law Enforcement Officers' and Firefighters' Continuation of Benefits Fund to be eligible for the continuation of benefits for dependents of an employee who died in a work-related death. To pay for ongoing claims, the bill requires an annual General Fund transfer of \$150,000 to the Benefits Fund from July 1, 2023, to July 1, 2025.

Background

In 2018, the General Assembly created the Police Officers' and Firefighters' Continuation of Benefits Board to facilitate the continuation of medical benefits for one year for the dependents of any person who dies in a work-related death, if the person was directly involved with offering police or fire protection services. Currently, employers must contribute to the Benefits Fund for the employees' dependents to be eligible for benefit continuation paid from the fund.

State Transfers

Beginning on July 1, 2023, and for two fiscal years thereafter, the bill transfers \$150,000 from the General Fund to the Law Enforcement Officers' and Firefighters' Continuation of Benefits Fund.

State Expenditures

The bill will increase expenditures from the Law Enforcement Officers' and Firefighters' Continuation of Benefits Fund by \$150,000 in each of FY 2023-24 through FY 2025-26. Expenditures are administered by the Police Officers' and Firefighters' Continuation of Benefits Board, which is supported by the Treasury Department.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

State Appropriations

For FY 2023-24, the bill requires an appropriation of \$150,000 from the Law Enforcement Officers' and Firefighters' Continuation of Benefits Fund to the Department of Treasury.
