Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that provides \$175,000 cash funds from the Wolf Depredation Compensation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for FY 2023-24. The bill also includes a clause that reduces a Long Bill appropriation to the Division of Parks and Wildlife in the Department of Natural Resources by \$175,000 General Fund.

JBC Staff Fiscal Analysis 1

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

This bill creates an ongoing obligation and requires a transfer of \$175,000 General Fund to the Wolf Depredation Compensation Fund in FY 2023-24, which is offset by a reduction of \$175,000 General Fund in the Long Bill. Beginning in FY 2024-25 and every year thereafter, the bill requires a transfer of \$350,000 General Fund to the Wolf Depredation Compensation Fund.
