The bill requires the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice to submit progress reports to the General Assembly on its sentencing reform study. The bill increases state workload on an ongoing basis through FY 2024-25.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: This revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires the Colorado Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice (CCJJ) within the Department of Public Safety to submit a progress report to the General Assembly on its study of sentencing reform on January 31, 2024, and January 31, 2025.

State Expenditures

CCJJ workload will increase to provide a sentencing reform study progress report. Because the CCJJ is currently working on this study, a progress report requires no change in appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
