Sunset Bill. This bill continues the State Noxious Weed Advisory Committee in the Department of Agriculture, which is scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2023. State fiscal impacts under the bill include only the continuation of the committee's current workload and minimal expenditures. The program is continued through September 1, 2034.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill continues the State Noxious Weed Advisory Committee in the Department of Agriculture, which is currently scheduled to repeal on September 1, 2023. The advisory committee is continued through September 1, 2034.

Continuing Program Impacts

Based on the Department of Regulatory Agencies' 2022 Sunset Review, the Department of Agriculture is expected to have no revenue and minimal expenditures to reimburse advisory board members for meals at in-person meetings. The advisory committee conducts a hybrid of in-person and online meetings, and only the in-person meetings incur any cost. If this bill is enacted, these expenditures will continue for the committee starting in FY 2023-24. If this bill is not enacted, the committee will end on September 1, 2023, and expenditures will decrease starting in FY 2023-24.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
