The bill gives the inspector general in the Department of Corrections the authority to arrest a fugitive. The bill may increase state workload on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary:	No appropriation is required.

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Summary of Legislation

The bill gives the inspector general in the Department of Corrections (DOC) and its investigators the authority to seek out and arrest a fugitive upon request of the DOC or law enforcement agency. Starting on March 1, 2024, the DOC must report to the General Assembly on the number of times the inspector general or an investigator was used to seek out and arrest a fugitive.

State Expenditures

Starting in FY 2023-24, upon request of the DOC or a law enforcement agency, workload to the inspector general and its investigators will increase to help seek out and arrest a fugitive and to report the incident to the General Assembly. This workload can be accomplished within existing resources.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on June 5, 2023, and takes effect on August 7, 2023, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
