## **Summary of Legislation**

The bill makes transfers from the General Fund and the Revenue Loss Restoration Cash Fund to the State Emergency Reserve Cash Fund on June 30, 2023.

## **Background**

**State Emergency Reserve Cash Fund.** Expenditures from this fund may be authorized only in the event of a declared emergency, as required under the Colorado Constitution's TABOR Amendment. The fund is included as part of the TABOR emergency reserve in the head note of each year's Long Bill.

Revenue Loss Restoration Cash Fund. Created through Senate Bill 21-289 from federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding, expenditures from this fund may be used for the provision of specified government services. House Bill 22-1411 included a number of transfers related to the federal Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund, including a \$10.0 million General Fund transfer to the Revenue Loss Restoration Cash Fund. This amount remains available for appropriation or transfer.

#### **State Transfers**

On June 30, 2023, the bill transfers funds to the State Emergency Reserve Cash Fund in the following amounts:

- \$20.0 million from the General Fund; and
- \$10.0 million from the Revenue Loss Restoration Cash Fund.

#### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
