Water Resources and Agriculture Review Committee. The board of veterinary medicine (board) is required to promulgate rules establishing certain veterinary medicine tasks that a licensed veterinarian may delegate to veterinary technicians and veterinary technician specialists and the recommended level of supervision for the tasks.

A licensed veterinarian may delegate tasks pursuant to the board's rules after first establishing a veterinarian-client-patient relationship with an animal or group of animals and the owner of the animal or animals. The licensed veterinarian is required to provide an appropriate level of supervision of the veterinary technician or veterinary technician specialist in accordance with applicable rules of the board. If there are not applicable rules related to the specific veterinary task that is being delegated, the veterinarian may delegate the task based on the assessment of the veterinary medical care being provided, the experience, education, and training of the person providing the care, and in compliance with all state and federal laws.

Beginning on January 1, 2026, the bill authorizes a veterinary technician to receive a veterinary technician specialist designation as part of the veterinary technician's registration, grants title protection for veterinary technician specialists, and prohibits the unauthorized practice as a veterinary technician specialist by a person who does not have a veterinary technician specialist designation.

- 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly

- 3 finds and declares that:
- 4

(a) In Colorado, there is an increasing need for veterinary care,

- 5 both for companion animals and for livestock or production animals;
- 6

(b) Licensed veterinarians in Colorado are stretched thin from the

- 7 increased demands for veterinary care, especially in rural areas of the
- 8 state where clients and patients may have more limited access to9 veterinary care;

10 (c) Many veterinary practices in Colorado employ veterinary
11 technicians or veterinary technician specialists, who are staff that are

educated and trained to perform various veterinary services and are often
 underutilized by supervising veterinarians;

3 (d) Clear guidelines are needed for veterinarians regarding the
4 veterinary services that may be delegated to veterinary technicians and
5 veterinary technician specialists to efficiently and effectively utilize the
6 education, training, and expertise of all veterinary staff and ensure that
7 Colorado's animals have adequate access to veterinary care; and

8 (e) Expanding the scope of practice for veterinary technicians and 9 veterinary technician specialists and authorizing licensed veterinarians to 10 delegate specific tasks to veterinary technicians and veterinary technician 11 specialists will allow these veterinary professionals to contribute more to 12 the delivery of veterinary care.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-315-104, amend
(6), (10), (10.5), (13), (21), and (21.5); and add (5.5), (16.3), (16.5), and
(26) as follows:

16 12-315-104. Definitions. As used in this article 315, unless the
 17 context otherwise requires:

18 (5.5) "DELEGATION" OR "DELEGATE" MEANS A LICENSED
19 VETERINARIAN'S ACT OF ENTRUSTING TO AN INDIVIDUAL THE AUTHORITY
20 TO PERFORM A TASK UNDER THE APPROPRIATE LEVEL OF SUPERVISION
21 BY THE LICENSED VETERINARIAN AFTER THE LICENSED VETERINARIAN HAS
22 DETERMINED THAT THE INDIVIDUAL IS COMPETENT TO PERFORM THE
23 TASK.

(6) "Direct supervision" means the supervising licensed
veterinarian is readily available on the premises where the patient is being
treated AND IS ABLE TO SUPERVISE THE TASKS THAT HAVE BEEN
DELEGATED TO AN INDIVIDUAL.

(10) "Immediate supervision" means the supervising licensed
 veterinarian and any person being supervised are in direct contact with the
 patient IS PHYSICALLY IN THE IMMEDIATE AREA ON THE PREMISES AND
 WITHIN AUDIBLE OR VISUAL RANGE OF THE PATIENT AND THE INDIVIDUAL
 PERFORMING THE TASKS THAT HAVE BEEN DELEGATED BY THE
 LICENSED VETERINARIAN.

7 (10.5) "Indirect supervision" means supervision in which the
8 supervising licensed veterinarian directs or supervises the authorized
9 delegated NEED NOT BE ON THE VETERINARY PREMISES BUT:

(a) treatment or collection of diagnostic information of a patient
at veterinary premises without being on the premises but being PROVIDES
EITHER WRITTEN OR VERBAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE TASKS THAT HAVE
BEEN DELEGATED TO AN INDIVIDUAL; AND

(b) Is readily available for communication.

(13) "Patient" means an ANY animal OR GROUP OF ANIMALS that
is examined or treated by a licensed veterinarian and includes herds,
flocks, litters, and other groups of animals.

18 (16.3) "SUPERVISING LICENSED VETERINARIAN" MEANS A
19 LICENSED VETERINARIAN IN THE STATE WHO DELEGATES AND ASSUMES
20 RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE VETERINARY CARE PROVIDED TO A PATIENT BY
21 AN INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED AT THE SAME PHYSICAL PRACTICE LOCATION
22 AND WORKING OUT OF THE SAME PHYSICAL PREMISES AS THE LICENSED
23 VETERINARIAN AND WORKING UNDER AN APPROPRIATE LEVEL OF
24 SUPERVISION BY THE LICENSED VETERINARIAN.

(16.5) (a) "SUPERVISION" MEANS A LICENSED VETERINARIAN'S
OVERSIGHT AND MONITORING OF ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL'S ASSISTANCE IN
THE TREATMENT OF ANIMALS AS PART OF THE VETERINARIAN'S PRACTICE

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1 OF VETERINARY MEDICINE.

- 2 (b) "SUPERVISION" INCLUDES:
- 3 (I) DIRECT SUPERVISION;
- 4 (II) IMMEDIATE SUPERVISION; AND
- 5 (III) INDIRECT SUPERVISION.

6 (21) "Veterinary premises" or "premises" means a veterinary
7 office, hospital, clinic, BUILDING, MOBILE UNIT, FACILITY, or temporary
8 OTHER location where veterinary medicine is being practiced MEDICAL
9 SERVICES ARE PROVIDED by or under the direction and supervision of a
10 licensed veterinarian.

(21.5) "Veterinary professional" means a veterinarian licensed
 pursuant to this part 1 and OR a veterinary technician OR VETERINARY
 TECHNICIAN SPECIALIST registered pursuant to part 2 of this article 315.

15 (26) "VETERINARY TECHNICIAN SPECIALIST" MEANS A VETERINARY
 16 TECHNICIAN WHO HAS BEEN AWARDED DESIGNATION FROM:

17 (a) AN ACADEMY RECOGNIZED BY THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF
18 VETERINARY TECHNICIANS IN AMERICA'S COMMITTEE OF VETERINARY
19 TECHNICIAN SPECIALITIES OR ITS SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION, WHICH
20 ORGANIZATION IS A RECOGNIZED VETERINARY TECHNICIAN SPECIALIST
21 ORGANIZATION; OR

(b) A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED VETERINARY TECHNICIAN
SPECIALIST ORGANIZATION APPROVED BY THE BOARD PURSUANT TO
SECTION 12-315-201 (1)(c).

SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-315-105, amend
(1) introductory portion, (1)(j), and (2)(a); and add (1)(r), (1)(s), and
(1)(t) as follows:

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1 12-315-105. License requirements and exceptions - definitions 2 - rules. (1) A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not practice veterinary 3 medicine in this state if the person INDIVIDUAL is not a licensed 4 veterinarian. A person AN INDIVIDUAL shall not practice artificial 5 insemination or ova transplantation of cattle or other animal species in 6 this state except in accordance with RULES ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO 7 section 12-315-106 (5)(c). AN INDIVIDUAL NOT LICENSED AS A 8 VETERINARIAN PURSUANT TO THIS PART 1 SHALL NOT DIAGNOSE, ISSUE 9 PROGNOSES FOR, PRESCRIBE FOR, OR PERFORM SURGERY ON AN 10 ANIMAL. This article 315 does not prohibit:

(j) Any person INDIVIDUAL from performing duties other than
diagnosis, prescription, surgery, or initiating treatment TASKS under the
direction and APPROPRIATE LEVEL OF supervision of BY a licensed
veterinarian who shall be IS responsible for the person's INDIVIDUAL'S
performance IN ACCORDANCE WITH BOARD RULES ADOPTED PURSUANT TO
12-315-105.5.

17 (r) AN INDIVIDUAL ACTING UNDER AT LEAST INDIRECT
18 SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED VETERINARIAN FROM PROVIDING CARE TO
19 ANIMALS LOCATED AT AN ANIMAL SHELTER THAT ARE THE PROPERTY OR
20 UNDER THE STEWARDSHIP OF AN ANIMAL SHELTER IF:

(I) THE INDIVIDUAL IS PERFORMING TASKS IN COMPLIANCE WITH
A WRITTEN OR VERBAL PROTOCOL PROVIDED BY THE SUPERVISING
LICENSED VETERINARIAN; AND

24 (II) THE SUPERVISING LICENSED VETERINARIAN HAS DETERMINED
25 THE INDIVIDUAL HAS RECEIVED SUFFICIENT AND PROPER TRAINING;

1 35-42-103 IF THE INDIVIDUAL IS AN OWNER OF AN ANIMAL OR IS AN 2 INDIVIDUAL ACTING UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE OWNER OF THE ANIMAL 3 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1)(f)(I) OF THIS SECTION; OR 4 (t) AN INDIVIDUAL FROM PERFORMING TASKS ON LIVESTOCK 5 UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED VETERINARIAN AND: 6 (I) THE SUPERVISING LICENSED VETERINARIAN HAS ESTABLISHED 7 A VETERINARIAN-CLIENT-PATIENT RELATIONSHIP WITH THE LIVESTOCK 8 AND THE OWNER OF THE LIVESTOCK; 9 (II) THE INDIVIDUAL IS PERFORMING TASKS IN COMPLIANCE WITH 10 WRITTEN OR VERBAL INSTRUCTIONS OR COMMUNICATIONS DEVELOPED BY 11 THE SUPERVISING LICENSED VETERINARIAN; AND 12 (III) THE SUPERVISING LICENSED VETERINARIAN HAS DETERMINED 13 THE INDIVIDUAL PERFORMING THE TASKS HAS RECEIVED SUFFICIENT AND 14 PROPER TRAINING. 15 (2) (a) Notwithstanding subsection (1)(f) of this section, and 16 except as permitted by subsection (1)(j) of this section, a person who is 17 not a licensed veterinarian shall not administer, distribute, dispense, or 18 prescribe prescription drugs. Except as provided in subsection (2)(b) of 19 this section, a licensed veterinarian must have a veterinarian-client-patient 20 relationship with the animal and its owner or other caretaker in order to 21 administer, distribute, dispense, or prescribe prescription drugs to or for 22 an animal. A LICENSED VETERINARIAN MAY DELEGATE THE 23 ADMINISTRATION OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS OR THE FILLING OF A 24 PRESCRIPTION ORDER TO AN INDIVIDUAL UNDER AN APPROPRIATE LEVEL 25 OF SUPERVISION DETERMINED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ARTICLE 315 26 AND BOARD RULES ADOPTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-315-105.5 (4).

27 SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 12-315-105.5 as

12-315-105.5. Delegation to and supervision of veterinary
technicians, veterinary technician specialists, and other qualified
personnel - rules. (1) A LICENSED VETERINARIAN MAY DELEGATE TASKS
IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION AND RULES ADOPTED BY THE BOARD
PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.

7 (2)A LICENSED VETERINARIAN SHALL ESTABLISH A 8 VETERINARIAN-CLIENT-PATIENT RELATIONSHIP BEFORE THE 9 VETERINARIAN DELEGATES A TASK TO A VETERINARY TECHNICIAN, A 10 VETERINARY TECHNICIAN SPECIALIST, OR OTHER QUALIFIED PERSONNEL. 11 (3) (a) WHEN DETERMINING WHETHER TO DELEGATE A TASK TO 12 A VETERINARY TECHNICIAN, A VETERINARY TECHNICIAN SPECIALIST, OR 13 OTHER QUALIFIED PERSONNEL, A LICENSED VETERINARIAN SHALL 14 CONSIDER:

(I) THE LEVEL OF EDUCATION, SKILLS, TRAINING, LICENSING, AND
EXPERIENCE OF THE VETERINARY TECHNICIAN, THE VETERINARY
TECHNICIAN SPECIALIST, OR OTHER QUALIFIED PERSONNEL;

(II) THE APPROPRIATE LEVEL OF SUPERVISION FOR THE DELEGATED
TASK PURSUANT TO SUBSECTIONS (4), (6), AND (7) OF THIS SECTION
AND, IF RULES HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD, ANY APPLICABLE
RULES ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS
SECTION; AND

23 (III) WHETHER THE DELEGATION OF THE TASK COMPLIES WITH
24 ALL APPLICABLE STATE AND FEDERAL LAWS.

(b) (I) IF A LICENSED VETERINARIAN DELEGATES A TASK TO A
VETERINARY TECHNICIAN, VETERINARY TECHNICIAN SPECIALIST, OR
OTHER QUALIFIED PERSONNEL AND THAT TASK IS COVERED BY RULES

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ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION OR AN
 APPLICABLE BOARD RULE, THE LICENSED VETERINARIAN MUST PROVIDE
 SUPERVISION AT LEAST AT THE LEVEL OF SUPERVISION PRESCRIBED BY
 RULE.
