CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
REGULATORY AGENCIES.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

**SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of regulatory agencies for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023.** In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, section 2 of chapter 474, (SB 23-214), **amend** Part XIX as follows:
