CONCERNING FUNDING FOR CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, AND MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Capital construction information technology appropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023. In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, **amend** section 4 of chapter 474, (SB 23-214), as follows:
