**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101 **CONCERNING EXTENDING THE DEADLINE FOR THE COLORADO**  
102 **COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION'S STATEWIDE**  
103 **LONGITUDINAL DATA SYSTEM REPORT, AND, IN CONNECTION**  
104 **THEREWITH, EXTENDING A RELATED EXISTING APPROPRIATION.**

data system into a statewide longitudinal data system that connects K-12, postsecondary, and workforce information. A report was required on or before January 15, 2023, and on or before January 15, 2024. The bill extends each deadline 2 years, so that a report is required on or before January 15, 2025, and on or before January 15, 2026.

The department of higher education was appropriated \$3 million for the student success data system. The bill permits the department to spend the appropriated money through December 31, 2026.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-1-141, **amend** (7)  
3 as follows:

4           **23-1-141. Student success data system - student success data**  
5 **transparency - appropriation - definition - repeal.** (7) On or before  
6 ~~January 15, 2023~~ JANUARY 15, 2025, and on or before ~~January 15, 2024~~  
7 JANUARY 15, 2026, the commission shall submit a report to the house of  
8 representatives education committee and senate education committee on  
9 the work required and any barriers identified, including recommendations  
10 for legislative changes necessary, to deliver a statewide longitudinal data  
11 system that connects K-12, postsecondary education, and workforce  
12 information.

13           **SECTION 2.** In Session Laws of Colorado 2022, **amend** section  
14 4 of chapter 349 as follows:

15           Section 4. **Appropriation.** For the 2022-23 state fiscal year,  
16 \$3,000,000 is appropriated to the department of higher education. This  
17 appropriation is from the workers, employers, and workforce centers cash  
18 fund created in section 24-75-231 (2)(a), C.R.S., is of money that  
19 originates from the general fund, and is based on an assumption that the  
20 department will require an additional 1.0 FTE in the FY 2022-23 and FY  
21 2023-24 state fiscal years. To implement this act, the department may use

1 this appropriation for the student success data system. Any money  
2 appropriated in this section not expended prior to July 1, 2023, is  
3 available for expenditure ~~in the 2023-24 state fiscal year~~ THROUGH  
4 DECEMBER 31, 2026, for the same purpose.

5           **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,  
6 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for  
8 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state  
9 institutions.
