105	BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY AGENCIES AND MAKING
106	AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

Sunset Process - House Health and Human Services

HOUSE Amended 2nd Reading April 10, 2024 **Committee.** The bill implements the recommendations in the department of regulatory agencies' 2023 sunset review and report on the Colorado commission for the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind (commission) by:

- Continuing the commission for 7 years, until 2031;
- Establishing a permanent state auxiliary services program; and
- Changing the name of the deafblind citizens council to the deafblind advisory council.
- 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
- 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-21-108, amend
- 3 (1) as follows:
- 4 26-21-108. Repeal of article sunset review. (1) This article
 5 ARTICLE 21 is repealed, effective September 1, 2024 2031.
- 6 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, repeal
 7 (25)(a)(XII); and add (32)(a)(XI) as follows:
- 8 24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies
 9 and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment legislative
 10 declaration repeal. (25) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both,
- 11 are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2024:
- (XII) The Colorado commission for the deaf, hard of hearing, and
 deafblind created in article 21 of title 26;
- 14 (32) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both, are scheduled15 for repeal on September 1, 2031:
- 16 (XI) THE COLORADO COMMISSION FOR THE DEAF, HARD OF
 17 HEARING, AND DEAFBLIND CREATED IN ARTICLE 21 OF TITLE 26.
- 18 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-21-103, amend
 19 (1); repeal (2); and add (1.5) as follows:
- 20 26-21-103. Definitions. As used in this article 21, unless the
 21 context otherwise requires:

1	(1) "Auxiliary services" means those aids and services that assist
2	in effective communication with a person who is deaf, hard of hearing,
3	or deafblind, including but not limited to:
4	(a) The services of a qualified interpreter as defined by section
5	13-90-202 (8);
6	(b) The provision of a qualified communication access realtime
7	translation (CART) reporter;
8	(c) The provision of an assistive listening device; or
9	(d) The acquisition or modification of equipment or devices to
10	assist in effective communication with a person who is deaf, hard of
11	hearing, or deafblind. "ADVISORY COUNCIL" MEANS THE COLORADO
12	DEAFBLIND ADVISORY COUNCIL APPOINTED BY THE COMMISSION IN
13	ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 26-21-105 (2)(f).
14	(1.5) "AUXILIARY SERVICES" MEANS THOSE AIDS AND SERVICES
15	THAT ASSIST IN EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION WITH A PERSON WHO IS DEAF,
16	HARD OF HEARING, OR DEAFBLIND. "AUXILIARY SERVICES" ARE ALSO
17	KNOWN AS "COMMUNICATION ACCESS SERVICES" AND MAY INCLUDE BUT
18	ARE NOT LIMITED TO:
19	(a) The services of a qualified interpreter as defined in
20	SECTION 13-90-202 (8);
21	(b) The provision of a qualified communication access
22	REALTIME TRANSLATION (CART) REPORTER;
23	(c) THE PROVISION OF AN ASSISTIVE LISTENING DEVICE; OR
24	(d) The acquisition or modification of equipment or devices
25	TO ASSIST IN EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION WITH A PERSON WHO IS DEAF,
26	HARD OF HEARING, OR DEAFBLIND.
27	(2) "Citizens council" means the Colorado deafblind citizens

council appointed by the commission in accordance with section
 26-21-105 (2)(f).

SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-21-105, amend
 (2)(e), (2)(f)(I), (2)(f)(II), and (2)(f)(III) introductory portion as follows:
 26-21-105. Appointment of commission director - commission
 procedures - advisory council - creation. (2) (e) The commission shall
 encourage development and coordination of public and private agencies
 providing assistance to deaf, hard-of-hearing, and deafblind citizens
 PERSONS.

10 (f) (I) There is hereby created the Colorado deafblind citizens
11 ADVISORY council consisting of seven members.

(II) The citizens ADVISORY council will SHALL advise the commission, state and local governments, and other relevant entities on how to increase competitive integrated employment as defined by IN section 8-84-301, enlarge economic opportunities, enhance independence and self-sufficiency, and improve services for deafblind persons.

17 (III) The commission shall appoint initial members to the citizens 18 ADVISORY council by July 1, 2019. The commission shall designate four 19 members to serve an initial four-year term and three members to serve an 20 initial six-year term. After the initial terms, all subsequent appointees will 21 serve four-year terms. The commission shall appoint a qualified person 22 to fill any vacancy on the citizens ADVISORY council for the remainder of 23 any unexpired term. The citizens ADVISORY council must have HAS the 24 following appointees:

25 SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-21-106, repeal
26 (5); and add (5.5) as follows:

26-21-106. Powers, functions, and duties of commission -

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auxiliary services program - community access program - report rules - definitions. (5) On or before January 1, 2019, the commission
 shall establish a one-year pilot program to provide auxiliary services to
 state departments and agencies. The commission may continue the pilot
 program in subsequent years if the commission has adequate funding to
 provide auxiliary services through the pilot program. The commission
 shall:

8 (a) Identify at least two state departments or agencies to
9 participate in the pilot program during calendar year 2019;

(b) Create a process for participating state departments or agencies
 to request auxiliary services from the commission;

(c) Collect data on the utilization of auxiliary services through the
 pilot program; and

(d) Hire an independent contractor to evaluate the pilot program
and make recommendations regarding whether to expand the program to
additional state departments and agencies. The evaluation must be based
on utilization data from the first year of the program. The evaluation must
be included in the September 1, 2020, annual report required by section
26-21-106 (1)(e).

20 (5.5) (a) THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH AND MAKE
21 PERMANENT THE OPERATIONS OF THE STATE AUXILIARY SERVICES
22 PROGRAM CREATED IN SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS SECTION AS IT EXISTED
23 PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION (5.5). THE
24 COMMISSION SHALL:

(I) ARRANGE FOR THE PROVISION OF AUXILIARY SERVICES FOR
STATE DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES, INCLUDING THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE,
THAT EMPLOY OR SERVE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE DEAF, HARD OF HEARING,

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1 OR DEAFBLIND BY PERFORMING THE FOLLOWING FUNCTIONS:

2 (A) COORDINATING, ON A STATEWIDE BASIS, THE DAILY
3 SCHEDULING OF AUXILIARY SERVICES PROVIDED TO STATE DEPARTMENTS
4 AND AGENCIES;

5 (B) CREATING AND MANAGING EFFICIENT AND CONSISTENT 6 PROCESSES THROUGH WHICH AN AUXILIARY SERVICES PROVIDER MAY 7 SUBMIT REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION AND RECEIVE PAYMENT FOR 8 AUXILIARY SERVICES PROVIDED;

9 (C) CREATING AND MANAGING A PROCESS FOR THE INTAKE AND 10 FULFILLMENT OF REQUESTS BY STATE DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES FOR 11 AUXILIARY SERVICES, INCLUDING THE IDENTIFICATION, COORDINATION, 12 AND APPOINTMENT OF AUXILIARY SERVICES PROVIDERS TO MEET THE 13 NEEDS OF ALL PARTIES INVOLVED IN THE PROCEEDING, EVENT, OR 14 CIRCUMSTANCE FOR WHICH A REQUEST IS MADE;

15 (D) RESOLVING ANY ISSUES THAT MAY ARISE WITH REGARD TO 16 AUXILIARY SERVICES IN THE STATE DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY FOR WHICH 17 AUXILIARY SERVICES ARE PROVIDED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (5.5); 18 (E) COMMUNICATING WITH AUXILIARY SERVICES USERS, 19 AUXILIARY SERVICES PROVIDERS, AND APPOINTING AUTHORITIES, AS 20 DEFINED IN SECTION 13-90-202, IN THE STATE DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY 21 FOR WHICH AUXILIARY SERVICES ARE PROVIDED PURSUANT TO THIS 22 SUBSECTION (5.5);

(F) ESTABLISHING, MONITORING, AND PUBLISHING A LIST OF CART
PROVIDERS AND QUALIFIED INTERPRETERS, AS DEFINED IN SUBSECTIONS
(4)(g)(II)(A) AND (4)(g)(II)(B) OF THIS SECTION, ON THE COMMISSION'S
PUBLIC WEBSITE; AND

27 (G) GATHERING DATA ON THE FUNCTIONS DESCRIBED IN

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1 SUBSECTIONS (5.5)(a)(I)(A) to (5.5)(a)(I)(F) of this section; and

2 (II) CREATE AN ADVISORY COUNCIL TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS
3 TO THE COMMISSION CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF AUXILIARY SERVICES
4 TO STATE DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES.

5 (b) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL PROMULGATE RULES FOR THE
6 IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SUBSECTION (5.5) IN CONSULTATION WITH, OR
7 AS PROPOSED BY, THE COMMISSION AND THE DEAF, HARD OF HEARING, AND
8 DEAFBLIND COMMUNITY.

9 (c) THE COMMISSION SHALL INCLUDE DATA GATHERED PURSUANT
10 TO SUBSECTION (5.5)(a)(I)(G) OF THIS SECTION IN ITS ANNUAL REPORT
11 REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (1)(e) OF THIS SECTION.

SECTION 6. Appropriation. (1) For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$203,163 is appropriated to the Colorado commission for the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind cash fund created in section 26-21-107 (1), C.R.S. This appropriation is from the Colorado telephone users with disabilities fund created in section 40-17-104 (1)(a), C.R.S. The public utilities commission in the department of regulatory agencies is responsible for the accounting related to this appropriation.

19 (2) For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$203,163 is appropriated to 20 the department of human services for use by the office of adults, aging, 21 and disability services. This appropriation is from reappropriated funds 22 in the Colorado commission for the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind 23 cash fund under subsection (1) of this section, and is based on the 24 assumption that the office will require an additional 1.6 FTE. To 25 implement this act, the office may use the appropriation for the Colorado 26 commission for the deaf, hard of hearing, and deafblind.

27 **SECTION 7.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act

takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 1 2 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 3 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 4 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 5 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 6 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 7 8 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
