Bill Summary

Sunset Process - House Health & Human Services Committee. The bill implements the recommendation of the department of regulatory







agencies (department), as contained in the department's 2023 sunset review and report concerning the rule-making authority of the executive director of the department of early childhood (executive director). The bill continues the executive director's rule-making authority for 7 years, until September 1, 2031.

act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
