#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

### 101 CONCERNING TRANSFERS OF MONEY FOR CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. **Joint Budget Committee.** The bill requires the transfer, on July 1, 2024, of:

- \$160,844,354 from the general fund to the capital construction fund;
- \$70,811,334 from the general fund to the information technology capital account of the capital construction fund;
- \$500,000 from the general fund exempt account of the general fund to the capital construction fund;

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 3 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-75-302, amend 4 (2.3)(n), (2.3)(o), (2.5)(q), and (2.5)(r); amend as amended by House 5 Bill 24-1215 (2)(ss); amend as added by House Bill 24-1215 (2)(tt); and 6 **add** (2)(uu), (2.3)(p), and (2.5)(s) as follows: 7 24-75-302. Capital construction fund - capital assessment fees 8 - calculation - information technology capital account. (2) The 9 controller shall transfer a sum as specified in this subsection (2) from the 10 general fund to the capital construction fund as money becomes available 11 in the general fund during the fiscal year beginning on July 1 of the fiscal 12 year in which the transfer is made or on the date otherwise specified for 13 the transfer. Transfers between funds pursuant to this subsection (2) are 14 not appropriations subject to the limitations of section 24-75-201.1. The 15 amounts transferred pursuant to this subsection (2) are as follows: 16 (ss) On July 1, 2023, two hundred forty-seven million nine 17 hundred sixty-eight thousand two hundred eighty-seven dollars; and 18 (tt) On April 1, 2024, eighteen million nine hundred seventy-one 19 thousand one hundred dollars; AND 20 (uu) On July 1, 2024, one hundred sixty million eight 21 HUNDRED FORTY-FOUR THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FIFTY-FOUR DOLLARS. 22 23 (2.3) In addition to the sums transferred pursuant to subsections

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- 1 (2) and (2.5) of this section, the state treasurer and the controller shall 2 transfer a sum as specified in this subsection (2.3) from the general fund 3 to the information technology capital account created in subsection (3.7) 4 of this section as money becomes available in the general fund during the 5 fiscal year beginning on July 1 of the fiscal year in which the transfer is 6 made or on April 1 of the fiscal year if otherwise specified. Transfers 7 between funds pursuant to this subsection (2.3) are not appropriations 8 subject to the limitations of section 24-75-201.1. The amounts transferred 9 pursuant to this subsection (2.3) are as follows: 10 (n) On April 1, 2023, four hundred ninety-nine thousand five 11 hundred dollars; and 12 (o) On July 1, 2023, sixty-three million nine hundred thirteen 13 thousand nine hundred eighty-eight dollars; AND 14 (p) ON JULY 1, 2024, SEVENTY MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED ELEVEN 15 THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED THIRTY-FOUR DOLLARS. 16 (2.5) In addition to the sums transferred pursuant to subsections 17 (2) and (2.3) of this section, the state treasurer and the controller shall 18 transfer a sum as specified in this subsection (2.5) from the general fund exempt account of the general fund created pursuant to section
- 19 20 24-77-103.6 to the capital construction fund as money becomes available 21 in the general fund exempt account during the fiscal year beginning on 22 July 1 of the fiscal year in which the transfer is made. Transfers between 23 funds pursuant to this subsection (2.5) are not appropriations subject to 24 the limitations of section 24-75-201.1. The amounts transferred pursuant 25 to this subsection (2.5) are as follows:
  - (r) On July 1, 2023, five hundred thousand dollars; AND

(q) On July 1, 2022, five hundred thousand dollars; and
