A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING EXCHANGING MONEY RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL**
102 **CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND WITH STATE**
103 **MONEY, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, ENSURING THAT**
104 **MONEY RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL CORONAVIRUS STATE**
105 **FISCAL RECOVERY FUND IS SPENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH**
106 **DEADLINES ESTABLISHED IN FEDERAL LAW AND MAKING AND**
107 **REDUCING APPROPRIATIONS.**

Joint Budget Committee. The state received money from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund pursuant to the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" (ARPA money). ARPA money was deposited into the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund and then transferred to various cash funds (recipient funds) and appropriated for various programs.

The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer specified amounts of ARPA money from specified recipient funds at the close of the 2023-24 state fiscal year to the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund. The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer money from the general fund to a new ARPA refinance state money cash fund. Money in the new ARPA refinance state money cash fund is transferred to the specified recipient funds.

The bill requires the general assembly to appropriate ARPA money from the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund to state departments for personal services in fiscal year 2023-24. For fiscal year 2024-25, the general assembly shall appropriate the balance of the cash fund for personal services or for other purposes permitted under the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021", and the money so appropriated must be expended on or before January 31, 2025.

On December 1, 2024, any unspent and unobligated money in a recipient fund, other than money designated for personal services or operating costs that will be spent by January 31, 2025, reverts to the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund. The reverted money is continuously appropriated to any department designated by the governor for any purpose that was funded with general fund money in the general appropriations act for fiscal year 2024-25.

After December 31, 2024, any ARPA money in a recipient fund that was obligated as of December 31, 2024, but not expended on an eligible activity at the conclusion of the appropriation reverts to the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund and is continuously appropriated to any department designated by the governor for any purpose for which a general fund appropriation was made in the general appropriation act for the state fiscal year in which the reversion occurred.

The amount of general fund money appropriated in a line item in a general appropriations act is reduced by the amount of ARPA money appropriated pursuant to the bill's provisions that is spent for the line item.

The bill repeals the requirement for a subrecipient to obligate ARPA money by November 30, 2024.

The bill authorizes the state controller to take certain measures to implement the bill and ensure that ARPA money is expended within the time allowed by federal law. The governor and the state controller shall jointly submit a report to the joint budget committee, the speaker of the

house of representatives, the minority leader of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, and the minority leader of the senate about the transfers in the bill and about spending ARPA money.

The bill makes changes to various programs related to refinancing ARPA money, including clarifying spending and obligation deadlines for program money that is not ARPA money and exempting the use of state money from requirements for capitol construction projects that use federal money. The bill makes changes to appropriations.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration - legislative intent.**

3 (1) The general assembly finds and declares that:

4 (a) The state received money from the federal government
5 pursuant to the federal "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" (ARPA
6 money), and federal law requires that money to be obligated by December
7 31, 2024, and spent by December 31, 2026;

8 (b) ARPA money not obligated by December 31, 2024, must be
9 returned to the federal government;

10 (c) The state appropriated ARPA money for a number of programs
11 and purposes, but appropriating money is not an obligation for the
12 purposes of federal law; and

13 (d) To preserve the greatest flexibility for the state after December
14 31, 2024, and to ensure the uninterrupted implementation of programs, it
15 is in the best interest of the state to spend ARPA money before December
16 31, 2024, on eligible ARPA uses and substitute state funds for programs
17 that extend beyond December 31, 2024, and on personal services, as
18 permitted by federal law, before January 31, 2025.

19 (2) It is the general assembly's intent that:

20 (a) Most of the ARPA money appropriated for programs intended
21 to be spent after December 31, 2024, be substituted with state money,

1 changing the source of program funds while maintaining funding for the
2 programs;

3 (b) This act does not change the requirements, timelines, or
4 spending deadlines for any program; and

5 (c) The exchanged ARPA money be spent on personal services
6 retroactively in fiscal year 2023-24 and in the first half of fiscal year
7 2024-25 so that all of the state's unobligated ARPA money will be spent
8 by the end of 2024, ensuring compliance with federal deadlines.

9 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-75-226, **amend**
10 (2), (4)(a), (4)(c)(I), (4)(d), (5)(b) introductory portion, and (5)(f); and
11 **add** (1)(a.7), (1)(c.5), (3.5), (4.1), (4.2), (4.3), and (6.5) as follows:

12 **24-75-226. "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund -**
13 **creation - recipient funds - limitations - reporting - appropriations -**
14 **reduction in general fund appropriations - report - legislative**
15 **declaration - definitions - repeal.** (1) As used in this section, unless the
16 context otherwise requires:

17 (a.7) "DISCRETIONARY ACCOUNT" MEANS THE DISCRETIONARY
18 ACCOUNT CREATED IN THE FUND IN SUBSECTION (4)(a)(II) OF THIS
19 SECTION.

20 (c.5) "PERSONAL SERVICES" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH
21 IN SECTION 24-75-112 (1)(m).

22 (2) The "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund is hereby
23 created in the state treasury. The fund consists of money credited to the
24 fund pursuant to ~~subsection~~ SUBSECTIONS (3) AND (3.5) of this section.

25 (3.5) ON JUNE 30, 2024, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER
26 TO THE FUND THE FOLLOWING AMOUNTS FROM MONEY THAT ORIGINATED
27 FROM THE MONEY THE STATE RECEIVED FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE

1 FISCAL RECOVERY FUND FROM THE FOLLOWING RECIPIENT FUNDS,
2 INCLUDING A COMPANION FUND OR ANY ACCOUNT IN THE FUND, AT THE
3 END OF THE 2023-24 STATE FISCAL YEAR:

2 WITH SERVICES, RECOVERY CARE, AND HOUSING SUPPORTS FUND, CREATED
3 IN SECTION 24-32-732;

4 (i) ELEVEN MILLION TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-NINE
5 DOLLARS FROM THE DIGITAL INCLUSION GRANT PROGRAM FUND, CREATED
6 IN SECTION 24-37.5-904;

7 (j) ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED
8 SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT DOLLARS AND
9 FIFTY-FOUR CENTS FROM THE ECONOMIC RECOVERY AND RELIEF CASH
10 FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 24-75-228;

11 (k) THREE MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE HEALTHY FORESTS AND
12 VIBRANT COMMUNITIES FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 23-31-313;

13 (l) TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE HOUSING
14 DEVELOPMENT GRANT FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 24-32-721;

15 (m) TWENTY-NINE MILLION TWO HUNDRED NINE THOUSAND FIVE
16 HUNDRED SEVENTY-SIX DOLLARS FROM THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND
17 STRONG COMMUNITIES GRANT PROGRAM FUND, CREATED IN SECTION
18 24-32-133;

19 (n) SEVENTEEN MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE JUDICIAL
20 DEPARTMENT INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY CASH FUND, CREATED IN
21 SECTION 13-32-114;

22 (o) ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE MILLION SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND
23 DOLLARS FROM THE LOCAL INVESTMENTS IN TRANSFORMATIONAL
24 AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 24-32-729;

25 (p) NINETY-SIX MILLION ONE HUNDRED SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS
26 FROM THE MULTIMODAL TRANSPORTATION AND MITIGATION OPTIONS
27 FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 43-4-1103;

1 (q) FORTY-NINE MILLION SIX HUNDRED FIFTY-TWO THOUSAND NINE
2 HUNDRED THIRTY-SIX DOLLARS FROM THE REGIONAL NAVIGATION CAMPUS
3 CASH FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 24-32-727;

4 (r) SIXTY-EIGHT MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND
5 DOLLARS FROM THE REGIONAL TALENT DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE GRANT
6 PROGRAM FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 24-48.5-406;

7 (s) TWO HUNDRED NINETY-NINE MILLION THREE HUNDRED
8 SIXTY-TWO THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED TWO DOLLARS AND
9 SEVENTY-THREE CENTS FROM THE REVENUE LOSS RESTORATION CASH
10 FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 24-75-227;

11 (t) TWO MILLION THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE
12 RURAL PROVIDER ACCESS AND AFFORDABILITY FUND, CREATED IN SECTION
13 25.5-1-207;

14 (u) SEVENTY-FIVE MILLION THREE HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND
15 DOLLARS FROM THE STATE HIGHWAY FUND, CREATED IN SECTION
16 43-1-219;

17 (v) FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE WILDFIRE MITIGATION
18 CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT FUND, CREATED IN SECTION 24-33-117; AND

19 (w) TWENTY-TWO MILLION TWO HUNDRED TWELVE THOUSAND
20 THREE HUNDRED NINETY-NINE DOLLARS AND FOURTEEN CENTS FROM THE
21 WORKERS, EMPLOYERS, AND WORKFORCE CENTERS CASH FUND, CREATED
22 IN SECTION 24-75-231.

23 (4) (a) (I) The general assembly shall not appropriate money from
24 the fund EXCEPT AS DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION (4)(a) AND
25 SUBSECTION (5)(f) OF THIS SECTION. The general assembly may transfer
26 money in the fund to another cash fund that is established for the purpose
27 of using the money from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery

1 fund. Transfers from the fund to the general fund are prohibited. A
2 DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT USE MONEY APPROPRIATED PURSUANT TO THIS
3 SUBSECTION (4) FOR ANY PURPOSE PROHIBITED BY THE "AMERICAN
4 RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021". A DEPARTMENT SHALL COMPLY WITH ALL
5 REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION.

6 (II) If there is any of the money transferred to the fund under
7 subsection (3)(a) of this section remaining in the fund after any transfers
8 from the fund required by bills enacted during the 2021 regular legislative
9 session, then, of the remainder in the fund, the lesser of three hundred
10 million dollars or the remainder IS PLACED IN THE DISCRETIONARY
11 ACCOUNT, WHICH IS CREATED IN THE FUND, AND is continuously
12 appropriated to any department designated by the governor for any
13 allowable purpose under the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021".

14 (III) The money specified in subsection (3)(d) of this section IS
15 PLACED IN THE DISCRETIONARY ACCOUNT AND is continuously
16 appropriated to any department designated by the governor for any
17 expenditures necessary to respond to the public health emergency with
18 respect to COVID-19.

19 (IV) FOR THE 2023-24 STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE GENERAL
20 ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE MONEY FROM THE FUND TO ANY
21 DEPARTMENTS FOR PERSONAL SERVICES THAT WERE PAID FROM THE
22 GENERAL FUND IN STATE FISCAL YEAR 2023-24.

23 (V) FOR THE 2024-25 STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE GENERAL
24 ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE THE BALANCE OF THE FUND, EXCLUDING
25 MONEY REMAINING IN THE DISCRETIONARY ACCOUNT. THE GENERAL
26 ASSEMBLY MAY MAKE THE REQUIRED APPROPRIATIONS TO ANY
27 DEPARTMENT FOR PERSONAL SERVICES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

1 PERMITTED UNDER THE "AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021". ANY
2 MONEY APPROPRIATED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (4)(a)(V) MUST BE
3 OBLIGATED AS REQUIRED IN SUBSECTION (4)(d) OF THIS SECTION AND
4 EXPENDED ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 31, 2025.

5 (c) (I) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, in
6 order to ensure proper accounting for and compliance with the "American
7 Rescue Plan Act of 2021", whenever money is transferred or appropriated
8 to a recipient fund that also has money from other sources, the state
9 controller or department controller shall create a companion cash fund
10 that includes only the money the state received from the federal
11 coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund under section 9901 of title IX,
12 subtitle M of the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021", but that is
13 otherwise legally identical to the recipient fund, except as otherwise
14 provided in subsection (4)(c)(II) of this section. THE STATE CONTROLLER
15 MAY PRESCRIBE PROCEDURES TO PERMIT CONTINUED USE OF COMPANION
16 FUNDS, WITH PROPER SEGREGATION OF FUND SOURCES THROUGH
17 COMPLETION OF A PROJECT, FOR ANY MONEY APPROPRIATED FOR A USE
18 PERMITTED PURSUANT TO THE "AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021"
19 THAT IS PARTIALLY REFINANCED.

20 (d) (I) Money in the fund or a recipient fund THAT ORIGINATED
21 FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND must be
22 expended or obligated by December 31, 2024. Just prior to the close of
23 business on December 30, 2024, any unexpended appropriations from a
24 recipient fund THAT IS OF MONEY THAT ORIGINATED FROM THE
25 CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND AND THAT REMAINED IN THE
26 RECIPIENT FUND AFTER THE REVERSION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (4.2)
27 OF THIS SECTION that are not for expenditures to be made after December

1 31, 2024, that were obligated before that date, revert to the "American
2 Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund, and the state treasurer shall transfer
3 the unexpended and unobligated balance in the fund to the unemployment
4 compensation fund created in section 8-77-101 (1). Any money THAT
5 ORIGINATED FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND
6 THAT IS obligated by December 31, 2024, must be expended by December
7 31, 2026. Effective December 31, 2026, the state controller shall transmit
8 any unexpended money in the fund or a recipient fund to the United
9 States department of the treasury. MONEY IN A RECIPIENT FUND THAT DID
10 NOT ORIGINATE FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND
11 MUST BE EXPENDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ANY APPLICABLE LAW OR
12 APPROPRIATION.

13 (II) A subrecipient must spend ~~or obligate~~ money received from
14 the fund or a recipient fund by ~~November 30, 2024, and, by December 13,~~
15 ~~2024, shall notify the state agency from which the subrecipient received~~
16 ~~the money of the status of the money that is obligated or expended. The~~
17 ~~subrecipient shall return to the state any unexpended and unobligated~~
18 ~~money under terms dictated by the state controller, and the state treasurer~~
19 ~~shall transfer the amount returned to the unemployment compensation~~
20 ~~fund created in section 8-77-101 (1). Any money obligated by November~~
21 ~~30, 2024, must be expended by~~ December 11, 2026. On or before
22 December 11, 2026, the subrecipient shall return to the state any
23 remaining money under terms dictated by the state controller and
24 thereafter the state controller shall transmit the money to the United States
25 department of the treasury in accordance with the treasury's requirements.

26 (III) MONEY IN THE FUND OR IN A RECIPIENT FUND THAT
27 ORIGINATED FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND IS

1 OBLIGATED WHEN IT IS OBLIGATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE "AMERICAN
2 RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021" AND ANY FEDERAL RULES PROMULGATED
3 THEREUNDER. THE OBLIGATION CRITERIA IN THE "AMERICAN RESCUE
4 PLAN ACT OF 2021" AND FEDERAL RULES DO NOT APPLY TO MONEY IN THE
5 FUND OR IN A RECIPIENT FUND THAT DID NOT ORIGINATE FROM THE
6 CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND. MONEY THAT DID NOT
7 ORIGINATE FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND THAT
8 IS NOT OBLIGATED BY AN APPLICABLE DEADLINE IN STATE LAW DOES NOT
9 REVERT AND REMAINS AVAILABLE FOR EXPENDITURE IN ACCORDANCE
10 WITH ANY APPLICABLE APPROPRIATION. The state controller shall
11 determine whether money is obligated for purposes of determining the
12 deadline for expenditures and the reversion or repayment of money in
13 accordance with this subsection (4)(d).

14 (4.1) (a) (I) EFFECTIVE JUNE 30, 2024, THE AMOUNT OF GENERAL
15 FUND MONEY APPROPRIATED IN A LINE ITEM FOR PERSONAL SERVICES
16 EXPENSES IN THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT FOR STATE FISCAL YEAR
17 2023-24, SENATE BILL 23-214, IS REDUCED BY THE AMOUNT OF FEDERAL
18 FUNDS APPROPRIATED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (4)(a)(IV) OF THIS
19 SECTION THAT WERE SPENT FOR PERSONAL SERVICES IN THE LINE ITEM.

20 (II) EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 30, 2024, THE AMOUNT OF GENERAL
21 FUND MONEY APPROPRIATED IN A LINE ITEM FOR PERSONAL SERVICES
22 EXPENSES IN THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT FOR STATE FISCAL YEAR
23 2024-25, HOUSE BILL 24-1430, IS REDUCED BY THE AMOUNT OF FEDERAL
24 FUNDS APPROPRIATED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (4)(a)(V) OF THIS
25 SECTION THAT WERE SPENT FOR PERSONAL SERVICES IN THE LINE ITEM.

26 (b) TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY FEDERAL LAW, THE GOVERNOR
27 AND A DEPARTMENT THAT IS APPROPRIATED MONEY THAT ORIGINATED

1 FROM THE FUND SHALL SPEND THE MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH
2 IT IS APPROPRIATED BEFORE SPENDING MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE
3 FOR THE SAME PURPOSE.

4 (c) FOR THE PURPOSE OF BALANCING THE STATE BUDGET AS
5 REQUIRED BY ARTICLE X OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION DURING THE 2024
6 REGULAR LEGISLATIVE SESSION, THE AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED IN THE
7 GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACTS FOR STATE FISCAL YEAR 2023-24, SENATE
8 BILL 23-214, AND STATE FISCAL YEAR 2024-25, HOUSE BILL 24-1430, TO
9 EACH DEPARTMENT FOR PERSONAL SERVICES IS REDUCED BY THE AMOUNT

12 (4.2) (a) (I) ON DECEMBER 1, 2024, ANY UNSPENT AND
13 UNOBLIGATED MONEY THAT ORIGINATED FROM THE CORONAVIRUS STATE
14 FISCAL RECOVERY FUND, OTHER THAN MONEY DESIGNATED FOR PERSONAL
15 SERVICES OR OTHER OPERATING COSTS AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION
16 (4.2)(a)(II) OF THIS SECTION, THAT IS IN THE FUND, A RECIPIENT FUND, OR
17 THE DISCRETIONARY ACCOUNT REVERTS TO THE FUND. MONEY THAT
18 REVERTS TO THE FUND PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (4.2) IS
19 CONTINUOUSLY APPROPRIATED UNTIL JANUARY 31, 2025, TO ANY
