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HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 24-1005

- 101 CONCERNING REQUESTING THAT THE FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION
- 102 FACILITATE THE USE OF REPAIRABILITY SCORES THAT INDICATE
- 103 TO CONSUMERS THE REPAIRABILITY OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES.

1 WHEREAS, According to the e-waste monitors of the United 2 Nations Institute for Training and Research, more than fifty-nine million 3 tons of used electronic devices, equal to the weight of one hundred 4 sixty-one Empire State Buildings, are disposed of each year worldwide; 5 and

6 WHEREAS, The federal Environmental Protection Agency reports
7 that electronic waste is now the fastest-growing part of the municipal
8 waste stream in the United States; and

9 WHEREAS, Colorado consumers do not have easy access to

- trusted information concerning the repairability and longevity of
 electronic devices and are unable to consult such information before
 purchasing or seeking repair of electronic devices; and
- WHEREAS, The commissioners of the Federal Trade Commission
 voted unanimously in July 2021 to "closely coordinate with state law
 enforcement and policymakers to update existing law and regulation to
 advance the goal of open repair markets"; and
- 8 WHEREAS, A study cited in the Commission's May 2021 "Nixing 9 the Fix" report states that "[t]he lack of information concerning durable 10 and repairable products causes an asymmetry in the market balance and 11 leaves consumers unable to make the best buying decisions regarding to 12 their own needs"; and
- WHEREAS, Open repair markets allow manufacturers to
 voluntarily assign repair scores for electronic devices such as laptops,
 phones, and appliances for the purpose of advising consumers regarding
 the repairability of such devices; and
- WHEREAS, Repair scores function similarly to EnergyGuide
 labels by providing consumers a one-to-ten score that reflects the
 availability of spare parts, ease of disassembly, and longevity of support
 that is associated with an electronic device, thereby informing consumers
 who seek to repair rather than replace such products; and
- WHEREAS, Repairability scores are a critical tool for consumers whose budgets are squeezed by rising prices. According to the Public Interest Research Group, an average American family spends about one thousand seven hundred dollars on new electronics per year, and an open repair market for electronic devices could save American families a combined forty-nine billion dollars annually by empowering them to repair rather than replace such devices; and
- WHEREAS, Samsung's research on existing repair scores in France showed that eighty-six percent of surveyed French consumers said that repair scores affect their purchasing behavior, and eighty percent indicated they would give up their favorite electronic device for a more repairable electronic device; now, therefore,

3	Assembly requests:		

4 (a) That the Federal Trade Commission establish criteria that 5 manufacturers of electronic devices may use to voluntarily assign 6 repairability scores to such devices, which scores range from one to ten 7 and may be displayed to consumers at point of sale;

- 8 (b) That the Commission periodically update such criteria; and
- 9 (c) That the Commission, in establishing and updating the criteria, 10 include consideration of:
- (I) The free and public availability of technical documents
 regarding an electronic device;
- 13 (II) The ease of disassembly of an electronic device;
- 14 (III) The availability of spare parts for an electronic device;
- 15 (IV) The price of spare parts for an electronic device;
- (V) The length of time that a manufacturer offers software support
 for an electronic device; and
- 18 (VI) Other criteria specific to certain categories of electronic19 devices.
