101 **MEMORIALIZING FORMER REPRESENTATIVE ALICE BORODKIN.**

1 WHEREAS, Our beloved former colleague, Alice Borodkin,
2 departed this life in April 2023 at the age of 89; and

3 WHEREAS, Alice Borodkin was born in New York City on April
4 16, 1933; and

5 WHEREAS, Alice Borodkin was the wife of the late Howard
6 Borodkin and, after his death, the late Arnold Brodsky, the mother of
7 Steven Borodkin and Julie Borodkin, and the grandmother of Zachary
8 Borodkin; and

9 WHEREAS, Alice Borodkin, as a member of the Democratic
10 party, served as a state representative for Denver and Arapahoe Counties
11 from 2001 through 2008; and

12 WHEREAS, Representative Borodkin not only served on the
13 House committees on Business Affairs and Labor, Finance, and
14 Transportation and Energy and the joint Transportation Legislation
15 Review Committee, but also served as the chair of the interim committee

2 WHEREAS, As a state representative, Alice Borodkin sponsored
3 many bills, including House Bill 1143, which created the Interagency
4 Task Force on Trafficking in Persons, and in 2006 she was the House
5 prime sponsor for Senate Bill 207, which made human trafficking a
6 felony; and

7 WHEREAS, Beyond her achievements in the legislature, Alice
8 Borodkin was a pilot, an editor, the director of a women's shelter, and the
9 author of the 2015 memoir *Caught Between the Bettys*; and

10 WHEREAS, Alice Borodkin's civic involvement included
11 membership in the National Abortion Rights Action League as well as
12 Planned Parenthood; and

13 WHEREAS, Representative Borodkin was well respected
14 throughout the capitol, and her presence will be greatly missed; now,
15 therefore,

16 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the*
17 *Seventy-fourth General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

18 That, in the death of Alice Borodkin, the people of Colorado have
19 lost a dedicated public servant and outstanding citizen, and that we, the
20 members of the Colorado House of Representatives, do hereby extend our
21 deep and heartfelt sympathy to the members of her family and pay tribute
22 to a faithful servant of the State of Colorado.
