SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 24-019 101 CONCERNING COLORADO YOUTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP AWARENESS 102 WEEK. 1 WHEREAS, Colorado is home to the only bank in the world 2 specifically designed for young people 21 years of age and under, the 3 Young Americans Bank; and 4 WHEREAS, In 1984, Bill Daniels, known as the "father of cable 5 television", read about a group of Denver students unable to obtain a bank loan, and Daniels realized that our society was doing a disservice to youth 6 7 by not allowing their participation in our financial system; and 8 WHEREAS, Bill Daniels' response to the problem was to create 9 a bank just for young people that would teach them financial principles, and the Young Americans Bank opened in Denver, Colorado, during 10

9 10 11 12 13 14	WHEREAS, By 1988, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit was formed to provide programs complementing the educational mission of the Young Americans Bank; this nonprofit, now known as the Young Americans Center for Financial Education, still functions today to provide a variety of hands-on programs that develop financial skills and relevant learning for youth; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, To this end, the YouthBiz program at the Young Americans Center for Financial Education was created, the largest and most comprehensive youth-serving entrepreneurial organization in Colorado; and
19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27	WHEREAS, The YouthBiz program offers different curriculum options for a range of ages, such as YouthBiz StartUp, which lays the foundations of business and entrepreneurship and is geared toward middle school students; YouthBiz Out of the Box, which builds upon the foundation of YouthBiz StartUp by taking students through the business cycle as they start a real-life business venture; and YouthBiz Stars, which is tailored for youth ages 6 to 21 who are interested in business ownership and includes workshops, business tours, mentorship opportunities, and competitions; and
28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, Starting as one small bank in 1987, the Young Americans Bank has served more than 79,000 customers, and the Young Americans Center for Financial Education has served more than 750,000 program participants; and
32 33 34	WHEREAS, Research demonstrates that a large percentage of people of all ages lack basic financial knowledge to ensure long-term financial stability for themselves and for their families; and

6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, Young people have already worked to contribute to our nation's economic success, and our nation will continue to benefit in the future by equipping them with financial education and tools to support their success; now, therefore,
