Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates a total of \$99,986 General Fund for FY 2024-25, including \$55,179 to the Department of Labor and Employment and \$44,807 to the Department of Personnel. Of the amount appropriated to the Department of Personnel, \$44,807 is reappropriated to the Department of Law. This provision also states that the appropriation is based

on the assumption that the Department of Labor and Employment will require an additional 0.5 FTE and the Department of Law will require an additional 0.2 FTE.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSP) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$63.1 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$9.5 million).

This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$99,986 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$63.1 million set aside by the same amount.
