	The bill would have required schools to include terms in any contract with a digital education provider that contains a termination clause if certain content is accessible to students. The bill would have increased school district workload beginning in FY 2024-25.		
Appropriation Summary:	No appropriation was required.		
Fiscal Note Status:	The final fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill. The bill was deemed lost in the Senate on May 9, 2023; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.		

### **Summary of Legislation**

Beginning July 1, 2024, the bill requires that contracts between a public school or district and a digital education provider include a termination clause ending the contract if the provider's content contains advertisements, embedded links or URLs. School districts may be entitled to reimbursement against the vendor if the contract is breached.

## **School District**

Schools will update their policies to modify contracts with digital education providers and distribute information to parents to comply with the bill. The exact costs for this workload will vary between school districts.

### **Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
