Summary of Legislation

The bill clarifies that a declaration which forms a common interest community must be executed by, or with the authorization of, the owners of the real estate to be included. An amendment to a declaration that adds real estate to an existing common interest community must be executed, by, or with the authorization of, the owner of the real estate to be added.

State Expenditures

The Homeowners' Association (HOA) Information and Resource Center in the Department of Regulatory Agencies serves as a resource for consumers to understand rights and responsibilities under the law. The center also registers common interest communities such as HOAs and other housing cooperatives, tracks complaints, and notifies HOAs of statutory changes. Workload may increase for the center to respond to questions from HOAs and residents. This workload is expected to be minimal and no change in appropriation is required.

Local Government

Starting in FY 2024-25, workload and revenue from filing fees for the county clerk and recorder's office may increase to process declaration amendments. This workload and fee revenue is expected to be minimal.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 15, 2024, and takes effect on August 7, 2024, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
