**Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a net total of \$200,000 General Fund to the Department of Agriculture for FY 2024-25. The provision

includes a transfer of \$464,630 General Fund and 2.8 FTE from the Animal Industry Division to the new Division of Animal Welfare. The amendment also appropriates \$200,000 General Fund to the new Division for additional work outlined in this bill.

### Points to Consider

#### *General Fund Impact*

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSP) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$63.1 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$9.5 million).

This bill requires a net General Fund appropriation of \$200,000 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$63.1 million set aside by the same amount.

#### *Related Budget Information*

The bill creates a new Division of Animal Welfare that will be reflected in the Long Bill in future years.

The attached Fiscal Note mentions an additional \$1,055,647 General Fund and 5.7 FTE appropriated through House Bill 24-1430 (Long Bill) to support animal welfare initiatives within the Department of Agriculture. This is inaccurate, as the approximately \$1.1 million is the sum of the appropriation across two fiscal years. House Bill 24-1430 only includes an appropriation of \$560,647 and 2.7 FTE for FY 2024-25.

**J.001** moves \$464,630 General Fund from the FY 2024-25 Long Bill appropriation for the Animal Industry Division to the new Division of Animal Welfare. This number reflects the new amount appropriated for animal welfare initiatives in the FY 2024-25 Long Bill, minus centrally appropriated costs.
