Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$95,609 General Fund to the Department of Law for FY 2024-25. This provision also states

that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.8 FTE.

L.003 Bill Sponsor amendment **L.003** (attached) makes a technical correction to eliminate an effective date of July 1, 2025 from the bill, which precludes the Department of Law from accessing the required appropriation in FY 2024-25.

The Committee should adopt both amendment J.001 and amendment L.003.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$93.5 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$14.0 million).

This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$95,609 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount.

Technical Issues

The bill, as amended by the Senate Committee on Business, Labor, and Technology, has an effective day of July 1, 2025, however, the Department of Law indicates it requires an FY 2024-25 appropriation for costs to startup the program prior to requiring social media companies' compliance with provisions outlined in the bill. Adopting amendment **L.003** corrected this technical issue and allows the appropriation included in amendment **J.001** to be effective starting in FY 2024-25.
