Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$121,700 General Fund to the Department of Education for FY 2024-25.

L.003 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment **L.003** (attached) adds a provision to make the program created in this bill an authorized use of the State Education Fund. Based on this proposed change, Bill Sponsor amendment J.002 appropriates \$121,700 cash funds from the State Education Fund to the Department of Education for FY 2024-25.

The Committee may adopt L.003 in combination with either J.001 or J.002, but should <u>not</u> adopt more than one of the "J" amendments.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$93.5 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$14.0 million).

As referred from the Education Committee and if J.001 is adopted, this bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$121,700 for FY 2024-25, reducing the \$93.5 million set aside by the same amount.

If the Committee adopts L.003 and J.002, the funding for this bill will instead be from the State Education Fund.
