The bill prohibits the restriction of a home-based business in a common interest community. It minimally increases state expenditures starting in FY 2024-25.

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**Appropriation Summary:** No appropriation is required.

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**Fiscal Note Status:** The final fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

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## Summary of Legislation

The bill prohibits a homeowner association (HOA) from restricting the operation of a home-based business in an HOA unit. HOAs may enforce reasonable rules on home-based businesses regarding architectural control, parking, landscaping, noise, nuisance, or other applicable matters. Additionally, home-based businesses must comply with local noise and nuisance ordinances.

## State Expenditures

The HOA Information and Resource Center in the Department of Regulatory Agencies serves as a resource for consumers to understand rights and responsibilities under current law. The center also registers common interest communities like HOAs and other housing cooperatives, and tracks complaints. Workload may increase for the center to respond to questions from HOAs and residents. This workload is expected to be minimal and no change in appropriations is required.

## Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 19, 2024, and takes effect on August 7, 2024, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
