AN ACT**CONCERNING THE TRANSFER OF MONEY FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE COLORADO CRIME VICTIM SERVICES FUND.**

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-505.5, **amend** (2) as follows:

24-33.5-505.5. Colorado crime victim services fund - creation - uses - applications for grants - legislative declaration - repeal. (2) (a) The Colorado crime victim services fund is created in the state treasury and referred to in this section as the "fund". The fund consists of money transferred to the fund pursuant to ~~subsection (4)~~ SUBSECTIONS (2)(b) AND (4) of this section and any other money that the general assembly may appropriate or transfer to the fund. Money in the fund is continuously appropriated to the division for crime victim services grants, as described in subsection (3) of this section.

(b) (I) ON JULY 1, 2024, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER FOUR MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE FUND.

(II) THIS SUBSECTION (2)(b) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2025.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,
