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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101 **CONCERNING CHANGES TO THE PROSECUTION FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM.**

**Bill Summary**

*(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <http://leg.colorado.gov>.)*

A prosecution fellowship program in the department of higher education provides money to the Colorado district attorneys' council (CDAC) to fund fellowships for persons who have recently graduated from a law school in Colorado to allow them to pursue careers as prosecutors in rural Colorado. The program, through a prosecution fellowship committee, places up to 6 fellows in rural district attorneys' offices throughout the state each year.

The bill changes the prosecutor fellowship program to provide

fellowship funding to rural district attorneys' offices to recruit and hire new deputy district attorneys rather than selecting and placing fellows in rural district attorneys' offices. The selected offices then use the money to recruit and hire new district attorneys. The bill requires the prosecution fellowship committee to determine which rural district attorneys' offices receive funding. On or before January 1, 2028, CDAC shall provide a report to the judiciary committees regarding the prosecutor fellowship program.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-19.3-101, **amend**  
3 the introductory portion; and **add** (4) as follows:

4           **23-19.3-101. Definitions.** As used in this ~~article~~ ARTICLE 19.3,  
5 unless the context otherwise requires:

6           (4) "RURAL DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE" MEANS A DISTRICT  
7 ATTORNEY'S OFFICE WITHIN THE THIRD, FIFTH, SIXTH, SEVENTH, NINTH,  
8 ELEVENTH, TWELFTH, THIRTEENTH, FOURTEENTH, FIFTEENTH, SIXTEENTH,  
9 OR TWENTY-SECOND JUDICIAL DISTRICT OF COLORADO.

10           **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-19.3-102, **amend**  
11 (1)(a), (1)(b), (2)(a), (2)(b), (2)(d), (2)(e), (3), (4) introductory portion,  
12 and (4)(a) as follows:

13           **23-19.3-102. Prosecution fellowship program - creation -**  
14 **committee - administration - conditions.** (1) (a) ~~There is created~~ The  
15 prosecution fellowship program IS CREATED in the department to provide  
16 ~~moneys~~ MONEY to the Colorado district attorneys' council to fund RURAL  
17 DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE fellowships for persons who have ~~recently~~  
18 graduated from a REGIONALLY ACCREDITED law school in Colorado and  
19 allow them to pursue careers as prosecutors in rural Colorado. The  
20 general assembly may appropriate ~~moneys~~ MONEY to the department for  
21 distribution to the Colorado district attorneys' council to implement the

1 provisions of this ~~article~~ ARTICLE 19.3 AND TO PROVIDE FELLOWSHIP  
2 FUNDING TO A RURAL DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE SELECTED FOR THE  
3 FUNDING.

4 (b) ~~The program will match law school graduates for one-year~~  
5 ~~fellowships with rural district attorneys' offices throughout Colorado. The~~  
6 ~~initial fellowships will be awarded in fiscal year 2015-16. The program~~  
7 ~~may fund the salary and benefits for up to six fellows each year. The~~  
8 ~~fellows are independent contractors and not employees of the Colorado~~  
9 ~~district attorneys' council. The program is limited to law school graduates~~  
10 ~~from the university of Colorado school of law and the university of~~  
11 ~~Denver Sturm college of law. Each law school shall contribute an equal~~  
12 ~~amount toward twenty percent of the cost of the fellowship salaries if the~~  
13 ~~school wants its students to be considered for the fellowship program~~ THE  
14 PROGRAM PROVIDES FELLOWSHIP FUNDING TO A RURAL DISTRICT  
15 ATTORNEY'S OFFICE IN AN AMOUNT DETERMINED APPROPRIATE BY THE  
16 FELLOWSHIP COMMITTEE THAT THE OFFICE SHALL USE TO RECRUIT, HIRE,  
17 AND RETAIN NEW DEPUTY DISTRICT ATTORNEYS.

18 (2) (a) ~~There is created~~ The prosecution fellowship committee IS  
19 CREATED, which ~~shall select~~ SELECTS the recipients of the fellowships.  
20 ~~and the fellowship locations.~~ The committee is comprised of ~~seven~~ FIVE  
21 members, ~~which include~~ INCLUDING:

22 (I) The executive director of the Colorado district attorneys'  
23 council, who ~~shall serve~~ SERVES as the chair of the committee; AND

24 (II) ~~The dean of the university of Colorado school of law;~~

25 (III) ~~The dean of the university of Denver Sturm college of law;~~

27 (IV) (II) Four elected RURAL district attorneys or their designees

1 appointed by the executive director of the Colorado district attorneys'

3 (b) The committee shall develop a fellow and A district attorneys'  
4 ~~offices~~ ATTORNEY'S OFFICE application process and determine the  
5 selection criteria for ~~fellows and district attorneys' office locations~~  
6 FELLOWSHIPS.

7 (d) ~~The members~~ EACH ELECTED DISTRICT ATTORNEY MEMBER of  
8 the committee shall serve without compensation FOR A TERM OF TWO  
9 YEARS AS DETERMINED BY THE FISCAL YEAR CALENDAR.

10 (e) The committee shall review applications received by the  
11 program, select ~~up to six fellows for the particular fiscal year plus any~~  
12 ~~back-up candidates as determined necessary by the committee, and select~~  
13 ~~up to six~~ THE district attorneys' office locations for placement of fellows  
14 ~~each year~~ OFFICES THAT WILL RECEIVE PROGRAM FUNDING FOR THE  
15 ELIGIBLE TIME PERIOD, AND DETERMINE THE APPLICABLE AWARD AMOUNT  
16 FOR EACH SELECTED OFFICE. After ~~selecting the fellows and~~ THE  
17 COMMITTEE SELECTS the district attorneys' office locations, the committee  
18 ~~shall match the fellows with a particular district attorney's office~~ OFFICES  
19 THAT WILL RECEIVE PROGRAM FUNDING, THE COLORADO DISTRICT  
20 ATTORNEYS' COUNCIL SHALL PROVIDE THE FUNDS TO THE SELECTED  
21 OFFICES.

22 (3) ~~In the event that the~~ IF A fellow who is receiving a fellowship  
23 FUNDING leaves the position the Colorado district attorneys' council shall  
24 ~~allocate any remaining awarded program moneys to funding a new~~  
25 ~~fellow, if the position is filled immediately, or to fund another fellowship.~~  
26 ~~If the position is not filled immediately or another vacant position does~~  
27 ~~not exist~~ WITHIN THE AWARD PERIOD, THE RECIPIENT OFFICE SHALL

1 RETURN ANY REMAINING FELLOWSHIP FUNDING TO THE COLORADO  
2 DISTRICT ATTORNEYS' COUNCIL. UPON RECEIPT OF ANY UNSPENT FUNDS,  
3 THE COMMITTEE MAY MEET AND AWARD THE FUNDING TO THE SAME OR  
4 ANOTHER DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE. EACH OFFICE THAT RECEIVES  
5 FUNDING SHALL RETURN ANY UNEXPENDED PROGRAM FUNDING TO THE  
6 COLORADO DISTRICT ATTORNEYS' COUNCIL. The Colorado district  
7 attorneys' council shall return any unexpended program ~~moneys~~ MONEY  
8 to the department AT THE END OF EACH FISCAL YEAR.

9 (4) ~~By January 1, 2019~~ ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2028, the  
10 Colorado district attorneys' council shall provide a report to the house of  
11 representatives and senate judiciary committees, or their successor  
12 committees, regarding the prosecution fellowship program. The report  
13 must include the following information regarding the placement of the  
14 fellows:

15 (a) For each ~~fellow placed, whether the fellow obtained deputy~~  
16 ~~district employment with~~ FELLOWSHIP AWARDED, the DISTRICT  
17 ATTORNEY'S office ~~where he or she was placed, with a different rural~~  
18 ~~district attorney's office, or an urban district attorney's office~~ RECEIVING  
19 THE AWARD; THE AMOUNT OF THE FELLOWSHIP FUNDING AWARDED; AND  
20 THE STATUS OF ANY FELLOW'S EMPLOYMENT WITH THE OFFICE, WITH ANY  
21 OTHER DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE WITHIN COLORADO, OR OTHER  
22 EMPLOYMENT, IF KNOWN, AFTER THE FELLOWSHIP ENDS;

23 **SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
24 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
25 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except  
26 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V  
27 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this

1 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take  
2 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
3 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
4 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
