

PREM

→ In collaboration with the STROBE NSF Science and Technology Center for Real-Time Functional Imaging at the University of Colorado—Boulder and Norfolk State University, Fort Lewis College will lead a partnership giving 70 undergraduate researchers at Fort Lewis and Norfolk State, in addition to 20-25 high school researchers, access to enhanced educational, research, and career preparation experiences around material science.

NOYCE

→ FLC and New Mexico's San Juan College (SJC) were awarded over \$1 million from the National Science Foundation to create the Four Corners Noyce Scholars program, which aims to increase the number of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) graduates from both schools who also earn teaching certifications.

SCHUSTERMAN FAMILY FOUNDATION

→ This foundation donated \$304,958 over three years for "Career Pathways to Promote Tribal Nation Building" to provide a funded academic and/or professional STEM experience that promotes tribal nation building and places students in a pipeline to a career in Native communities.

NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION

→ FLC launched the Engineering Scholars Program (ESP) with \$1 million from the NSF. ESP aims to identify and engage academically talented, Pell-eligible students enrolled as Engineering majors and support them through both financial assistance and high impact experiences, including summer research with faculty, internships, professional development field trips, and international experiences.

KENNEDY CENTER HONORS

MOUNTAIN BIKING NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

FLC and RMPBS have partnered to create broadcast opportunities for students. A Producer-in-Residence, who works in an on-campus office, helps FLC students produce video projects and documentaries.

FOCUS ON STUDENT SUCCESS

SKYHAWK PERSISTENCE MICROGRANT PROGRAM

In December 2018, 23 FLC students received Skyhawk Persistence Grants to help them through unexpected financial hardships and continue in school.

SUMMER BRIDGE JUMPSTART PROGRAM

To assist them in the transition to college and set them up for success, incoming FLC students can join a seven-day pre-collegiate experience, exploring their academic interests with faculty and building a stronger relationship with their college community.

NAVAJO NATION HEALTH SCIENCES SCHOLARSHIP

One out of every five students currently enrolled in FLC's Health Sciences programs is Navajo. Navajo Nation President Russell Begaye signed an agreement with FLC to offer scholarships to Navajo students pursuing careers in health or exercise science.

HAWK TANK BUSINESS PLAN COMPETITION

FLC's business plan competition starts its fourth year in 2019, with the notable addition of a track just for local high school students, competing for \$47,000 worth of scholarships.
